Meet your TDs

This is a continuing series of profiles of tournament directors working at the NABCs.

Nancy Boyd's introduction to tournament directing actually had little to do with the profession and everything to do with her primary interest at the time, which was playing.



The year was 1971 and Boyd, who now lives in San Ramon CA (San Francisco Bay area), at the time was fresh out of college and playing a lot of bridge.

"I decided I wanted to understand what the tournament directors were talking about when they came to the table," she recalls.

So she took the tournament director test with no intention of doing anything with it beyond her stated goal. In fact, National TD Tom Quinlan asked her at one point if she wanted to take up directing and she politely declined.

A native of Oakland CA, Boyd is a lifelong resident of the bay area. She studied math in college and worked for Blue Cross of California in their actuarial division for a time before becoming an actuarial division manager.

After about a decade and a half of toiling for Blue Cross, Boyd decided she preferred working for herself, so she quit and started a word processing and desk-top publishing business. "I learned how to be really poor," she says.

Eventually that business morphed into her current job as co-founder of a consulting group that does human resources work for school districts in 37 states.

Along the way, Boyd married and had two sons, but when they grew up she decided – about 10 years ago – to check with Quinlan to see if the TD offer was still open.

Tonight's ethnic entertainment

Klezmer is the Yiddish word for a folk musician. It refers to traditional Jewish dance melodies from Eastern Europe. The lost art of the klezmer has been revived over the past three decades as part of the World Music movement. Traditionally played at weddings and other celebrations, klezmer music has now become part of the performance arts repertoire and includes songs of the Yiddish theater in addition to folk music.

As Jewish immigrants came to America, they brought this style with them. They adapted it to American tastes and instrumentation. The result was an organic fusion of everything from Russian dances, Chassidic drinking songs and Hungarian gypsy bravado blended with Dixieland, early jazz and swing and even a Yiddische Rhumba! Because of this, a klezmer concert is a true variety show.

The Maxwell Street Klezmer Band has been one of the Midwest's premiere Klezmer Bands for over twenty years. Performing both for public concerts in the U.S. and worldwide, Maxwell Street has been central to the revival of traditional Jewish music in the Midwest. It is one of the true Klezmer "Big Bands," recalling the rich, jazzy sounds of the Swing Era.

The band will perform at 6:45 p.m. near Columbus Hall.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an announcement, use the announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Troubles with doubles

We've all been taught at mother's knee that when the opponents have opened the bidding, in order to make an overcall, you must have a five-card suit. So what do we do when this type of hand comes along?

♠ K Q 6 4 ♥ K J 8 2 ♦ A 6 3 2 ♣ 7

Suppose your right-hand opponent (RHO) opens the bidding with 1♣. If you bid 1♠, you will be promising a good five-card suit. What's more, partner will inevitably have a singleton spade and a bunch of hearts. Bidding hearts or diamonds is equally wrong. The solution is to make partner pick the suit, by making a takeout double. You say double and partner is forced to bid now.

Note that the fewer cards that you own in the opponents' suit, the more cards you will have in all the other suits. Partner is being forced to bid, so the more cards you have in the suits partner will choose from, the more useful your hand will be as a dummy.

Responding to a takeout double:

When partner makes a takeout double, you must respond and may not pass (with one rare exception). However, if your RHO makes a bid, then the pressure is off and you no longer need to respond. If you do respond after an intervening bid, you are now promising 8 or more points.

Since you are forced to respond to the takeout double, no points are required. The takeout doubler wants to know your best suit and your point count. On the following hands, your LHO has opened with 1♦ and your partner has made a takeout double. RHO has passed.

♠ 5 4 3 2 ♥ 5 4 3 ♦ 5 4 3 ♣ 5 4 3

This is a dreadful hand, but you will bid 1♠. When, as responder to a takeout double, you bid your best suit at the cheapest level, you will have 0-8 points.

♠ J 5 4 3 ♥ 9 4 2 ♦ 9 2 ♣ A K J 5

Bid 2♠, showing 9-11 points and four or more spades.

♠ A Q 8 7 6 ♥ 8 2 ♦ 6 5 4 ♣ A K 5

Bid 4♠. You must have a five-card major to jump to game (partner does not guarantee four spades). You have an opening hand and partner has promised about the same. Go for it!

♠ 9 5 4 ♥ 8 7 6 ♦ A Q 7 ♣ K 9 8 6

Bid 1NT. This will show 8-10 HCP and a stopper in the opponent's suit. Note: when you find yourself about to respond to a takeout double of a minor suit, stop and consider whether you could bid notrump.

With 11-12 HCP and stoppers in the



opponent's suit, bid 2 NT. With 13 + HCP, bid 3 NT

Rebids by the takeout doubler

You have doubled a 1♦ opening bid with

♠ A K 7 6 ♥ K 6 3 2 ♦ 5 ♣ J 8 7 4

and partner has responded 1♠. The next player passes. What is your call? You should pass! I know you don't want to! But you have already promised partner that you have at least an opening bid (13+ points). You have also promised that if you are the doubler with only 13-15 pts. you will have at least adequate trump support for all the unbid suits. Do you have anything more than that? No — so you pass. Only with extra values (16 or more points) can you take another bid.

And another thing

Your RHO opens the bidding with 1♦. What is your call with this hand?

♠ A Q 6 3 ♥ 9 6 ♦ A 7 5 4 ♣ Q J 8

With this hand, you must pass. Do not double. The odds are high that partner will bid hearts. You will now be forced to say pass (see above regarding rebids by doubler with 13-15 points). Your hand will become the dummy and partner will not be happy with your trump support.

Remember that with only 13-15 points the doubler must always have adequate trump support for all of the unbid suits, not just most of them. You are forcing partner to bid with as little as

♠ 4 3 2 ♥ 5 4 3 2 ♦ 4 3 2 ♣ 4 3 2

Passing partner's takeout double

Suppose you are South and you hold

♠ 7 6 5 ♥ A 9 8 ♦ Q J 10 9 8 ♣ 6 2

West North East South

1♦ Dbl Pass ?

Yes, with this hand you can pass as you plan on beating them in 1♦. This comes up once every five years (if you play a lot of bridge) and in order to pass partner's takeout double, you must have at least three sure trump tricks and an outside ace.

If you only have their suit, but your hand is not suitable for passing the double, you have a problem, as you would with the following hand in the following auction

♠ 7 3 2 ♥ 8 7 6 ♦ K 10 5 4 3 ♣ 4 3

West North East South

1♦ Dbl Pass ?

If you pass, you will now be converting partner's takeout double to a penalty double.

If you pass, the opponents will probably make 1♦ doubled. They will score lots of points for doubled overtricks and the insult of being doubled. Partner will not understand. Remember that once you have lost partner's trust, it takes years to regain that trust!

When your only long suit is the opponent's suit and you are the responder to the takeout double . . . you must respond. So on the hand above, make your cheapest bid in a three-card suit — in this case, 1♥.

Opening lead: ♣K.

Bidding commentary: Strong eight-card suits with less than opening bid strength (fewer than 10 HCP) should open four, not three! South checks for aces and bids the slam. North must have a play for slam with this dummy.

Defensive commentary: When holding the K-Q-J of a suit along with a side-suit ace, the K-Q-J suit is the preferred lead. Also, when dummy tables, East knows that West has an ace (South showed only one in the bidding).

Play commentary: South has two chances to make this contract, not one! He crosses to the closed hand with a trump and leads a spade, not a diamond! If West has the ♠A, the diamond finesse is not necessary. After West takes the ♠A, the ♠K furnishes a diamond discard. If East has the ♠A, a diamond finesse is still available. In effect, declarer is taking two finesses. If the diamond finesse is taken first and it loses, declarer is down even though West may have the ♠A. Two chances are better than one.

When declarer has a singleton facing a king plus another finesse available in a long suit and declarer can afford to lose one trick, lead the singleton suit first. If the ace is well placed it may mean no finesse will be necessary in the longer suit.

No good options

Bill Pollack reported this nice play by Eric Rodwell from the second semifinal session of the Life Master Pairs. Pollack had two winners and a trump trick in a four-card ending, but could not score a trick! Pollack was playing with Marty Fleisher, and the duo came in second. (Deal rotated.)

Fleisher led the ♣4 to the ace and back came a second club. Rodwell ruffed, played a spade to the queen and ran the ♥Q, ducked all around. He repeated the heart finesse, cashed the ♦A and the ♠K, crossed to the ♠A, and went back to the ♦K. This was the ending:

When Rodwell led the ♦J, Fleisher won the queen. It would have done Pollack no good to ruff, so he pitched a club (as good as a spade). Fleisher's forced club play was ruffed in dummy, but what could Pollack do? Overruffing would have tantamount to concession since the ♥K would be overruffed with the ace, but pitching the spade would be just as bad since the lead would be in dummy for a trump coup.

Rodwell made 11 tricks for plus 450 and a great score.

Want to play Mid-Chart conventions? Read this first!

Players who wish to use Mid-Chart methods (in events that permit them) must check the ACBL Defense Database for rules governing their use.

If you choose to play a method permitted by the Mid-Chart, you are required to do the following:

1. Pre-Alert the opponents about your method prior to the auction on the first board.
2. Have a complete written description of the method available for your opponents.
3. For certain methods, you must provide your opponents with an approved defense from the database. Visit the ACBL web site at www.acbl.org for details.

The seven matters

Playing in my first Spingold Knockout Teams, I had a chance to be a hero on Tuesday. We were in the third quarter of what was, at the time, a tight match against the No. 8 seeded team captained by Carolyn Lynch. My partner, Mark Leonard, and I were sitting North-South against Mike Passell and Eddie Wold when this deal came up.

My partner led the ♦K.

I followed to the diamond with my singleton jack, and Passell won the ace. He then played a

heart to dummy's ace, a heart to his king and ruffed a heart. Then he ran off all six trumps.

I had only clubs left to pitch on the final two trumps. This was the position in the four-card ending:

Passell played his last trump, my partner discarded the ♥Q, dummy threw the ♦9 and it was up to me to defeat the contract, which I could have done by discarding the ♣J or ♣10 from my hand. Unfortunately, I carelessly pitched by ♣7. Had I jettisoned a the jack or 10, when Passell led the ♣9 and I saw my partner's 8, I could play and 7 if Passell played low from dummy. He would then be stuck in hand and have to give my partner two diamond tricks at the end. If Passell played the ♣9 to the queen, I could win and return a club, promoting the setting trick in clubs.

Sometimes you have already stepped off the curb before you notice the bus about to hit you!

More discipline

Did I mention before that improved focus and discipline would be worth a lot of points to almost all of us? Here is another example from a bracketed knockout game.

Dlr: West ♠ 10 8 6 2
 Vul: Both ♥ 9
 ♦ 9 6 5 4 3

North led the ♦6 to the queen and king, and South cashed the ♦J, North following with the 4. South thought that this showed an initial holding of four cards, expecting the 9 to be played from five cards. He continued with the ♦A to force dummy to ruff – an effective defense should North hold four spades to the 10 or four to the K-10.

Alas, declarer was able to ruff in hand and pitch a club from dummy. Declarer now drew four rounds of trumps. What should South discard? He had better choose three clubs – after all, what use will those clubs be in front of declarer's holding?

See what happens if South pitches that "useless" ♦2. Declarer continues with the ♥K and another heart, and when North shows out, ducks. South wins but declarer has three hearts and a club to come – 10 tricks in all. If South keeps the ♦2, he has a winner to cash if he gains the lead.

At the table, South was irritated by North's carding and stopped thinking, discarding the low diamond. It isn't always easy, but keep focus, keep thinking and discuss after the game what went wrong – maybe it is you who misunderstands your partnership agreements.

Incidentally, had South known the diamond position, he would probably have switched to a low club at trick three. After the 10 forces the king, South is squeezed on the run of the trumps and 10 tricks are easy. The third diamond lead was correct all along.

Platinum invitation

I've been playing at the NABC for most of the week with my regular partner. On Tuesday, my partner's son came in for a day. As a change of pace, I played with him Tuesday evening. When we went to sign up for the side game, it turned out the directors had another event with a late scratch and they needed a pair to fill in to complete a table. Of course, we accepted.



My partner for the game has some very strange bidding ideas. For example, he doesn't believe in inviting. At all. Luckily, we play Precision with 2/1 responses non-forcing, so it's not as crippling as it may seem.

I have maybe 200 masterpoints, and my partner had less than half of that. It was clear that whatever event we were playing in, we were outclassed by the competition. We bid straight to game when it looked like we might have it, and competed freely when we didn't. We ended up with an almost 53% game. The fact that my partner, for all his strange bidding ideas, is an excellent card player didn't hurt.

Our opponents were polite and friendly, and we were happy with the result. When I tried to find our score in the Daily Bulletin the next day, however, I discovered that the game we had filled in for was the qualifying round of the Wernher Open Pairs! Although we weren't eligible to play in the event the following day, we did earn 1.15 platinum points.

Maybe there's something to this idea (especially at matchpoints) that we spend too much inviting game, giving up too many bids that would allow us to compete for the partscore and revealing damaging information about our hands to the opponents.

Or maybe we were just lucky. All I know is that I'm going to have to find out what platinum points are!

On your marks, get set, . . .

The NABC+ Fast Open Pairs, which requires players to finish their two-board rounds in 11 minutes, begins today. The event consists of two qualifying sessions and two final sessions on Friday. Sessions begin at 1 and 4:30 p.m. each day.

Making the most of a favorable lead

Playing in Tuesday's Stratified Open Pairs, Lynda Rosenblatt took maximum advantage of a favorable opening lead on this deal (rotated) as declarer in a slam contract. Lynda was playing with Marvin Rosenblatt.

An opening diamond lead would immediately scuttle the contract, of course, but West lead the ♠10. Lynda tried the ♠Q just in case the king was onside, but East produced that card as declarer ruffed.

Lynda crossed to a high trump in dummy to play the ♠A, on which she made the correct discard of a low heart. She then cashed the ♥A K, returned to dummy with another trump and ruffed a heart. When the suit turned out to be 3-3, she was able to make one last trip to dummy with the ♣8 to enjoy a diamond discard on the established heart.

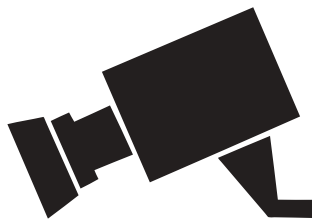
Rosenblatt conceded a diamond to make six for plus 1370.

Who wants the trick?

This deal from the Grand National Teams, Flight A, had many twists and turns, the last of which was not much fun for East. Declarer was David Grainger.

West led the ♣3. Declarer discarded a spade from dummy and took East's ♣J with the queen. Grainger then played a diamond to the 8, 9 and jack. Back came a club, and the position became clear when Grainger's ♣9 held. He played a diamond to dummy's 10, ducked by East. The ♥J was also ducked, but when declarer played a second heart to his king, West won the ace and exited with a spade.

Grainger inserted the ♠Q then extracted East's second spade by cashing the ace, and when he followed with a low diamond from dummy, East could see what was coming. Declarer had taken two clubs, a diamond, two spades and a heart, and if East played the ♦Q he would be able to cash the ♦A but then would be forced to play another club into declarer's known tenace. So East won the trick with the ♦A, continuing with the queen, aiming to endplay dummy (declarer would lose two diamonds, two spades and one heart).

Grainger had a counter, however. He simply played low on the ♦Q. Now East had no choice but to play a third round of clubs, and Grainger could claim with four club tricks, two hearts, two spades and one diamond. Plus 400 was good for a 10-IMP gain (North-South went minus).

Janice's squeeze

Janice Seamon-Molson is famous for saying she rarely relies on squeezes or other esoteric plays, preferring to simply take finesses. An exception arose in the Wagar Women's Knockout Teams (hands rotated).

West led the ♣K, and Seamon-Molson could see that if spades were 2-2, there would be no problem, so she cashed her two high spades, discovering that she had a spade loser.

She needed to get to dummy to discard her club loser, so Seamon-Molson cashed her ♥A and played a diamond from hand.

West contributed the ♦Q in a manner that suggested strongly to declarer that West had a very strong holding. Seamon-Molson won the ♦A and cashed the ♥K to pitch her losing club and considered how to come to a 12th trick. One option was to play the ♥J for a ruffing finesse against a possible ♥Q in the East hand. Another possibility was to simply ruff a heart and hope the queen dropped, but that was against the odds (if hearts were divided 5-3, the queen would be more likely to be in the hand with five).

After some consideration, Seamon-Molson simply ruffed a club to hand and conceded the inevitable spade loser to East.

A club was returned, and Seamon-Molson ruffed and ran trumps, squeezing West in the red suits for 12 tricks and plus 980, an 11-IMP gain (slam was not bid at the other table).

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the ACBL Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Chicago Mixed Board-a-Match Teams

The Mixed Board-a-Match Teams, one of the oldest ACBL events, begins play today.

The event, first played in 1929, is a four-session event with two qualifying and two final sessions.

At stake is the Chicago Trophy, awarded to the winners of the North American Open Teams Championship until 1965 when it was replaced by the Reisinger Memorial Trophy.

The Chicago Trophy was donated by the Auction Bridge Club of Chicago in 1929.

West pitched two clubs, and Itabashi inferred that if West held the ♠K – an entry – he would be holding on to all those good clubs. So after taking the last diamond in dummy, Itabashi played a spade to his jack, cashed the ace and played a third round. East had discarded a spade on the fourth diamond, so Itabashi now had three spade tricks. To add insult to injury, when East got the lead a second time, he was down to all hearts and was forced to lead away from the queen. Itabashi ducked and ended up with a tie for top with a score of plus 460.

army days, recounting how four friends would sneak off for all-night sessions, telling their wives that they were on "war maneuvers," a successful ploy until the ruse was discovered by one of the wives, who dispatched a message to the game – there would be a real war unless they returned home immediately!

The tournament at the elegant Islamabad club was a success. Although there are not too many tournament players in Pakistan, those who are there are true aficionados (okay, I'll admit that our team would have finished higher if we hadn't sat in the same direction in a crucial match, but you can't have everything).

The big news was that the president would attend the victory banquet (imagine President Bush doing the same!). General Musharraf is quite unique in his active support of the game.

Naturally, it wasn't long after the announcement that a huge contingent of security personnel arrived. They cordoned off the club from the early afternoon. It is common knowledge that the general has narrowly escaped several assassination attempts, a fact that you would never sense from his relaxed manner.

The highlight of the trip for me was being asked, after the dinner, to play with the president against two of his top generals. It was a fun game with the leg-pulling and interplay as important as the actual play.

The system of choice for me and the general was his army-manufactured strong club (19 or more high-card points) with responses that defined a point-count range.

The generals were no mean performers and, though my partner and I were in harmony (we both bid and doubled too much!), it wasn't long before we fell behind.

Now to be an established bridge player partnering the president of his country and to be beaten by mere generals is not too dignified. It was time to fight back.

So when I picked up
♠ 10 6 5 ♥ Q J 10 4 ♦ J 4 3 ♣ 10 8 6,

I decided to revert to type and opened a strong 1♣! My left-hand general passed, and the president responded 1♥, showing 7-8 HCP. Great system: I open a "strong" club and already know that the opponents have at least a game. Right-hand general doubled, I pass (sinking lower in my seat), and when LHG passes, partner bids 2♦. RHG passes (good!), I pass and everyone at the table – as well as a few of the security guards – bristles noticeably, while I slide deeper into my chair. To my relief, LHG passes, too.

The president respectfully commented that this was not the expected auction, but before anyone changed their mind, I put down my dummy, exposing the psych.

Roars of laughter erupted around the table (to their credit, equally from the opponents), and the general announced, "You see, Zia, how difficult my job is when my generals are so easily deceived."

The game ended soon after with honors about even, but the memories of the night with the generals remain priceless.

As I flew home, I reflected that if I could only send a copy of the general's strong club system to a few other world leaders, maybe . . .

South considered his second bid for some time before going for game in notrump, and Itabashi deduced that South probably had a running diamond suit and an unbalanced hand rather than simply a power raise to 3NT, which probably was cold.

So Itabashi doubled, gambling that this would trouble the opponents sufficiently that they might seek a different place to play. They didn't know, of course, that Itabashi had only four heart tricks.

The club game was down one on the lead of a heart, so Itabashi's gambit was successful. "Nothing ventured, nothing gained," said Itabashi in the post mortem, "but the next time I roll out the double, the opponents will have to guess if it is real or a bluff."

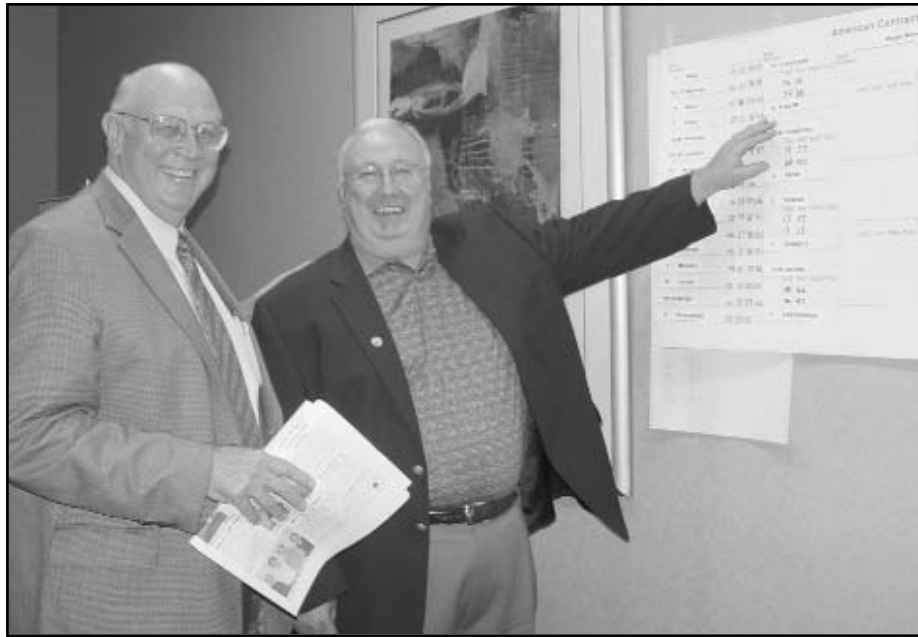

Ruling the Game

Assigning an Adjusted Score – Part 2

When the director decides to assign an adjusted score as a result of an irregularity committed by one of the players, he basically has two choices. He may choose to assign a result that was likely to have occurred without the infraction or he may assign an artificial adjusted score.

As a general preamble to this discussion, let me say that especially at the club level, too many artificial adjusted scores are assigned. Frequently, this is done because the club director who may also be the owner has to tread a thin line between enforcement of the Laws and good customer relations. Thus, all too often, one will hear of one side getting their actual score, which was a good one because of their infraction and the other side getting average - plus. These types of “two-way good” rulings should be avoided. In the long run, making rulings that are consistent with the laws in a fair and even tempered manner will get you more customers than you will lose.

When is it appropriate to award an artificial adjusted score? The answer to that question is when it is really impossible to play the board. Thus, if North looks at the traveler from a board he has yet to play in your club game, and there is nobody in the club that could take his place for that deal, you must award an artificial adjusted score. The score that a pair gets on that board traditionally gets a score based on their responsibility for the table not getting to play the hand. Thus, if you are East-West in the above example, as long as you did not touch the boards, you are totally blameless. Your side is usually given average-plus on the board. This is the equivalent of 60% of the matchpoints available on that deal. If top is 12, you get 7.2. If you are North-South, you will be held primarily responsible for not getting to play the board. That

will usually get you an average-minus (40%) of the matchpoints. Thus, in the example above, North and South get 4.8. If you and your partner are partially at fault for the board's not being played, you might expect to get an average or 6 matchpoints on a 12 top. If a pair who is awarded an average-plus has a game of greater than 60%, they receive the percentage of their score on the board in which the award was given.

A recent development in ACBL-sanctioned games is to award a “not played (NP)” on boards that don't get played. An example of a situation where a NP would be appropriate would be one where a pair through no fault of their own has to leave early. One gets a message that her mate is in the hospital and there is no one who can play with the partner. This is really no one's fault, so it seems wrong to assign an average-minus. Rather than doing that the director gives the pair (or the table) not played. This gives them no score for that board, but rather assigns the average of their scores on the other boards as their result on that board.

It is not intended that this not played will be awarded every time a board is not played. If a pair is deprived of the right to play a board through no fault of their own, they should get average-plus or their percentage score, whichever is greater. Likewise, a pair primarily responsible for the problem should be given an average-minus. But if neither pair is really responsible for the problem, an NP seems appropriate. Say that the game runs slowly and both pairs need to leave to get to appointments and there are no substitutes available. In that case, Not Played seems right.

In the next article, we will talk about what to do when a result is possible. In that case, it is almost always wrong to assign an artificial adjusted score. What the director needs to do is to determine what was likely to have happened had there not been an irregularity. That can be a challenging task and, as such, it is entitled to an article all its own.

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Tournament Terminology 101

If you're confused by the terms used to describe the different types of bridge events played at clubs and tournaments, you're not alone. Here's a list of common bridge terms with explanations.

Masterpoints: the unit which measures bridge achievement in competition. Masterpoints are awarded at ACBL clubs and tournaments in amounts proportional to the size and classification of the event and the rating of the club or tournament.

•**Black points:** awarded at club games. Some special club games award red, gold or silver points.

•**Red points:** awarded for section placements at regional tournaments and NABCs. Also awarded at clubs for special events such as the qualifying rounds of the North American Open Pairs and the Grand National Teams.

•**Gold points:** awarded for section firsts and overall placing in regionally rated events that have no upper masterpoint restrictions.

•**Platinum points:** awarded for NABC+ events.

Gold points are also awarded for sectional firsts and overall placing in regional events of two or more sessions that have a masterpoint limit of 750 or more points.

One gold point is awarded to section winners in the annual ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game in sections of seven or more tables.

In addition, new players may now win gold points in their own NABC events: .50 gold in the National 49er Pairs at the Spring NABC, 1.50 gold in the National 199er Pairs at the Summer NABC and 1.00 gold in the National 99er Pairs at the Fall NABC (the remainder of the award is in red points).

A major source of gold points is the bracketed knockout teams. The overall awards for the top brackets are all gold while the lower brackets may receive a percentage of gold points and the remainder in red points.

•**Silver points:** awarded for sectional firsts and overall placing at sectional tournaments. Also awarded at Sectional Tournaments at Clubs (StaC).

Barry Crane Top 500 race: This trophy is presented to the ACBL player who wins the most masterpoints during a calendar year.

Mini-McKenney races: In 1974 the ACBL Board of Directors voted to recognize masterpoint achievements among player below the rank of Life Master. The Bridge Bulletin recognizes leaders ACBL-wide. At the unit level, winners in each category receive recognition and special medallions.

All points won during a calendar year are counted in these races.

Ace of Clubs contests: This competition was created in 1984 to recognize achievement at the club level. Winners are recognized at the unit level as well as ACBL-wide.

Points won only at the club level — excluding the North American Open Pairs, the Grand National Teams and Sectional Tournaments at Clubs — are counted in these races.

Masterpoint races: ACBL recognizes the players who win the most masterpoints in their categories during the calendar year. The categories include Life Master, Bronze LM, Silver LM, Gold LM, Diamond LM, Emerald LM, Platinum LM, Grand LM, Youth, Junior, Sectional (points won only at sectional tournaments during the year),

Senior, Online and Richmond Trophy.

These are the various categories and the requirements for each category at the beginning of a calendar year:

Rookie: 0–5 masterpoints
 Junior Master: 5–20 points
 Club Master: 20–50 points
 Sectional Master: At least 50 points, including 5 silver

Regional Master: At least 100 points, including 15 silver plus 5 red or gold

NABC Master: At least 200 points, including 50 pigmented points of which 5 must be gold, 15 must be red or gold and 25 must be silver

Life Master: 300–500 points including 50

black, 50 silver, 25 gold and 25 red or gold

Bronze Life Master: 500–1000 points

Silver Life Master: 1000–2500 points

Gold Life Master: 2500–5000 points

Diamond Life Master: 5000–7500 points

Emerald Life Master: 7500–10,000 points

Platinum Life Master: 10,000 points, but no

North American Bridge Championship

Grand Life Master: 10,000 points and a North

American Bridge Championship or its equivalent

Youth: age 19 and younger

Junior: age 25 and younger

Sectional: points won only at sectional

tournaments

Senior: 55+ years, points won only in Senior

events

Online: points won in online (computer) play

Richmond Trophy: awarded to the Canadian
