Jill Meyers – world's #1 woman player

Who's the number one woman bridge player in the world?

None other than America's own Jill Meyers of Los Angeles.

The latest rankings issued by the World Bridge Federation, which includes the results of the recent world tournament in Bermuda, show that Meyers shot past Germany's Sabine Auken as the result of her team's silver medal performance in the Venice Cup.

Meyers' performance at world events in recent years is sensational:

- 1991 fourth in Venice Cup in Yokohama, Japan
- 1993 first in Venice Cup in Santiago, Chile
- 1997 first in Venice Cup in Hammamet, Tunisia
 1998 first in Women's Pairs in Lille, France
- 1998 tied for third in McConnell Teams
- in Lille, France
- 2000 second in Venice Cup in Bermuda

Add to that her accomplishments on the North America scene – winner of the Lou Herman Trophy in 1997, victor in the 1999 Blue Ribbon Pairs and a winner in seven other North American Championships.

Top-seeded Jacobs ousted in Vanderbilt

There is a new No. 1 seed heading into the round of eight today in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams. The team captained by Mike Moss assumed the top spot with a 150-105 defeat of the defending champions, led by George Jacobs.

Moss is playing with three members of Sweden's most recent Bermuda Bowl team -- Bjorn Fallenius, who lives in New York, and Magnus Lindkvist and Peter Fredin.

They took the measure of Jacobs, Ralph Katz, Howard Weinstein, Steve Garner and Italians stars Alfredo Versace and Lorenzo Lauria.

Moss led from start to finish in posting the upset and will face the Richard Schwartz squad in today's quarterfinal match. Schwartz and company eliminated the team captained by Rose Johnson-Meltzer, 142-98.

Some of the matches were nail-biters. The Nick Nickell squad, seeking to add the Vanderbilt to their trophy list for the first time, survived a furious fourth-quarter rally by the Jack Coleman team to win, 107-100.

The No. 4 seed, led by James Cayne, also had a close match, defeating the tired Steve Levinson team, 119-108. Levinson, Barnet Shenkin and Norwegians Boye Brogeland and Erik Saelensminde were the winners over the John Onstott team in double overtime. The second overtime set of eight boards was completed Wednesday before the round of 16 began Wednesday.

The new No. 3, led by Bobby Wolff, ousted upset winners Joe Quinn and company, who had Continued on page 5

Gordon and Chazen tops in Mixed Pairs

Dr. Jim Sternberg's bad luck turned out to be Linda Gordon's good luck. Dr. Sternberg's team lost its match in the Vanderbilt on Monday, so suddenly Bernie Chazen was available to be Gordon's partner in the Mixed Pairs. That was the winning combination in the Mixed – Gordon and Chazen piled up a 65.46% game in the final session to outdistance the field by a board and a half.

It's a brand new partnership – unless you count midnight games. Their only previous experiences as a partnership occurred in two midnight Swisses.

Rhoda Walsh, winner of Open Pairs I earlier in


Ken Warren expelled

Ken Warren, ACBL member O865216, was expelled from the ACBL for unethical actions detrimental to the ACBL. According to ACBL regulations, Warren may not apply for reinstatement for at least five years from Nov. 23, 1999, the date of his original discipline.

The Board heard three issues simultaneously – the mandated review of suspension of more than a year, an appeal by Warren for a decrease in discipline, and an appeal from the ACBL Recorder for an increase in discipline.

It was determined that Warren had been committing wrongful acts for several years. His first offense was copying results of boards he had not played in pair games. Later it was discovered that he was dealing honor cards to himself in team games.

Dutch invite Americans to Venice Cup rematch

Remember the nail-biting Venice Cup final in Bermuda where the Dutch team won the gold medal by defeating the United States by the incredibly small margin of half an IMP?

Well, believe it or not, there's going to be a rematch. A Dutch sponsor, at present anonymous, has invited the American squad to go to The Hague and play a return match against the Dutch champions.

Jill Meyers of the American team received official notification of the invitation only two days ago. No one can recall when a winner of a world championship event ever has issued a challenge to a rematch to the silver medal winner. But of course no world championship ever has been decided by so small a margin.

The unusual margin in Bermuda was the result of a slow-play penalty against both teams, with the Americans being charged with the greater

Team Trials to decide Senior entry

The winner of the Senior Team Trials will be eligible to represent the United States at the World Bridge Federation Senior Championship in Maastricht, the Netherlands, during the World Team Olympiad August 26-September 9, 2000. The Senior event will take place during the first week. The Trials will be held June 20-23 in Las Vegas concurrently with the Las Vegas Regional.

The entry fee for the Senior Cup will be paid from the Trials entry fees. All other expenses will be the responsibility of the team selected as the United States representative. Any net proceeds (excess of revenue from entry fees over expenses of running the trials) will be given as subsidy to the team to defray part of their expenses.

The trials will be open to teams of four, five or six players each of whom must have been born on or before Aug. 26, 1945.

Teams must enter no later than 10 p.m. (Las Vegas time) on June 19. Teams may enter on site. Teams may also register in advance by regular mail (ACBL, att: Rena Hetzer, 2990 Airways Blvd, Memphis TN 38116) or e-mail (Rena.Hetzer@acbl.org) Advance entries must be received in Memphis no later than close of business on June 15 and must be confirmed on site by June 19 at 10 p.m. Las Vegas time

The entry fee will be \$60 per team per session or \$120 per day.

If fewer than nine teams enter, the event will be straight knockout with all-day matches (head-tohead or three-way, seeded by masterpoints).

If nine to 12 teams enter, there will be a one-day round-robin to reduce the field to eight teams. If 13-25 teams enter, there will be a two-day round-

robin to reduce to eight teams. If the entry is more than 25 teams, there will be a two-day Swiss to reduce to eight teams. Once the field has been reduced to eight teams, the event will continue as a knock-out (seeded by order of finish in the qualifying) with all-day matches.

In round-robin play, the length of matches will be determined such that approximately 60 boards are played each day (two sessions per day). If there is a Swiss, there will be a total of 16 seven-board matches. The all-day knockout matches will be 64 boards.

First place overall will be 50 masterpoints (gold). Second through fourth (for 8 or fewer teams) and first through eighth (9 or more) will be per ACBL regulations.

Bridge Olympiad set for August

The 2000 Bridge Olympiad, a WBF World Championship event, will be held in Maastricht, the Netherlands Aug. 26 - Sept. 9.

The World Team Olympiad features two major contests --- the World Open Team Olympiad and the World Women's Team Olympiad. Each member country in good standing with the WBF is entitled to enter one team in each of these two events.

In addition to these major events there will be a Senior team event (round-robin is Aug. 27 - Sept. 2 followed, depending on the number of teams entered, by a semifinal and final), and a World Transnational Mixed Team (qualifying rounds played from Sept. 5 - Sept. 8 followed by the semifinal on Sept. 8 and final on Sept. 9). Additionally, the University Cup Team event is scheduled Aug. 26 - Sept. 3.

USA representation in the Open Team Olympiad, the Women's Team Olympiad, and the Senior Team will be determined by team trials. Teams must make application for the Open and Women's Trials with entries subject to the approval of the appropriate Credentials Committee. The Open International Team Trials (ITT) will be June 4-12 in Memphis TN. The Women's Team Trials (WITT) will be May 23 - May 30 in Raleigh NC (in conjunction with the Raleigh regional).

Canadian representation for the Olympiad Open and Women's Team events has been previously determined. Canadian representation for the Senior team event will be decided from amongst applications made to the Canadian Bridge Federation. Applications should include captain's name, ACBL player number, address, phone number and e-mail address. It should also include names and ACBL numbers of other team members, as well as professional/personal biographical information. Application deadline is May 1.

Depending on the number of applications received and the locations of teams applying, an effort will be made to hold a playoff. If a playoff is not possible or feasible, a Selection Committee will choose Canada's representative. The CBF will give the selected team \$1000 towards their entry fee. All other expenses are the responsibility of the selected team.

Teams from Mexico and Bermuda should apply to their national bridge organizations.

The World Transnational Mixed Teams is open to any member in good standing. Teams must apply for nomination through their national contract bridge organization. Teams may apply through the Memphis office at the contacts shown above. Soon, teams will be able to apply via the webpage.

Reports from the front



When you lose a Vanderbilt match by 13 IMPs, it is hard not to focus on the mistakes you made that cost the match. Then you start thinking about the bad luck that has terrorized you sufficiently to keep you from publishing the details of $3\clubsuit +1$ gaining 6 IMPs against 6NT down one when AQx opposite K10xxx failed to play for five tricks.

But instead I'd like to focus on the good bridge played by our opponents. We played all 48 of our boards against Fred Gitelman and Brad Moss, and I'd like to say it was a pleasure to play against them.

They did three very good things to help their team's cause. See what you think. First Brad, North, had

Brad heard his LHO open $1 \spadesuit$. His partner doubled and RHO passed. He bid $3 \clubsuit$ (he wanted to bid $2 \clubsuit$ but he thought so long that he felt that he was barred from doing that). Over 3NT he bid $4 \heartsuit$, and partner bid 4NT. What now? He passed, and this was the full deal:



Well, I guess if you are not going to make the obvious pass of 1♦ (it is not cheap, is it?), playing 4NT is pretty good. Plus 630 gained 13 IMPs.

Next came a decision for Fred.

♠ Q 9 7 5 3 **♥** A J 4 **♦** 8 5 2

♣ A K

- You open 1♠ and hear 2♠ on your left and 3♣ from partner. Fred had a tough decision. He elected to bid 3NT and scored a big gain. Facing

♣ Q 6 4 2

3NT was trivial with the ♦A-K onside, but when trumps split badly there were only nine tricks in each

contract.

Finally came this exhibit – see where you'd like to apportion blame and credit.

Before this board was scored up, we trailed in the match by 4 IMPs. Our teammates had bid to 5 doubled for 950, so any normal result would win the match for us. This was the auction at our table:

Gitelman's raise to $6\clubsuit$ meant that either East or West had to sacrifice to win the match. Once South is known to be 7-6, declarer can overcome the threatened trump promotion and escape for minus 500 in $6\spadesuit$ doubled.

Nervous Nelly

Aaron Cohen of Lakehurst NJ likes to tell stories. This one occurred at a bridge club in Westchester County, New York

Arsen Kazanjian, who had played in the afternoon session, noticed that every table but one was finished. So he sauntered over to see what was going on.


As he stood watching, a woman at the table turned to him and said, "I wish you wouldn't stand there like that. You make me nervous, and I can't concentrate."

When Kazanjian regained his composure, his response was: "But you're the dummy!"

Perhaps East should have bid $5 \heartsuit$ over $5 \clubsuit$, and maybe West should have bid $6 \spadesuit$ over $6 \clubsuit$. The fact remains that E-W passed out $6 \spadesuit$, and the Milner team went on to fight another day.

Taking care of business

A team of four ACBL Board members (and a spouse) won Bracket 2 of the First Friday-Saturday Knockout Teams. Good defense on this deal from the semifinal round helped the team – Richard Anderson, George Retek, Chuck Wilkinson, Robin Wilkinson and Jerry Fleming – to a 10-IMP gain.



The bidding was the same at both tables.

West North East South

1♣

Pass 1♥ Pass 2NT

Pass 3NT All Pass

At one table, Retek was South, playing with Robin Wilkinson. West's opening lead was the ♣10. Retek put up the jack, which held, and played a spade to his jack and West's king. West made his first error by switching to the ♥J, concealing the queen from partner as well as declarer. East won the ♥A and got out with a club. Retek went up with the ♣A and played the ♠A, getting the bad news in that suit. Retek then cashed the ♥K and played a spade to dummy's queen.

West erred again on that trick by discarding a heart. Retek could then exit dummy with a heart, establishing the ♥10. West won the ♥Q perforce and cashed the ♣K before getting out with a low diamond. Retek scored up plus 400.

At the other table, Fleming, playing with Anderson, was on lead against the notrump game. Fleming started with a low diamond, which went to East's queen and declarer's king. At trick two, declarer played a low club from hand to dummy's jack. He then followed with a spade to the jack and king. West got out with a diamond to dummy's ace. Declarer played a heart and put up the king when East played low. Next came the Δ A and a low heart from the South hand.

Fleming put up the \(\Psi \) and played a third round of diamonds. Declarer won with the jack and played a spade to dummy's queen.

A club went to declarer's queen and West's king, followed by the ∇Q . East won the ∇A and cashed the $\triangle 10$ for the setting trick.



He's a veteran now

Joel Wooldridge, one of ACBL's top Junior players, first came to the fore 10 years ago at the spring regional in Toronto. Ten-year-old Joel and his mother, Jill, won the Mixed Pairs going away in a tough field.

Mom was in Cincinnati for a couple of days this week, specifically to play in the Mixed Pairs. After two qualifying sessions, they stood third.

Two deals from the second qualifying session caught Joel's fancy.

South started with the excellent lead of the ♠J, and North judged well to duck, forcing Joel to use a hand entry early. Joel won the ♠Q and played a heart to the jack. Next came a club to the 10 and queen. South continued with the ♠10, which held. A third round of spades cleared the suit, and Joel led a diamond off dummy, putting in the king when North ducked.

Joel then played a heart to the king, wincing when North played the 10, and came off dummy with the \$10. North went up with the ace and cashed the long spade, exerting pressure on his partner.

South could not discard a diamond (Joel would then have a finesse position in diamonds against North's 9-6) or a heart (the ace would drop the queen), so he let go of a club. North's only choice was to exit with a diamond, but Joel won the queen and cashed the \P A. North, with the Φ 9 and the AK 9, could find no good discard. Plus 600 was a good score.

Joel found the next deal even more interesting.

Joel got off to the lead of the ♦2, which seems like a break for declarer, and when Jill put the ♦K on the 8, North missed the play that would have saved his contract. That play is to duck!

In effect, at trick one Jill had executed a Merrimac Coup -- the deliberate sacrifice of an honor to knock out a vital entry.

With little inkling that he was in trouble, declarer played a diamond to dummy's 9 and a low spade to the jack and king. Joel exited with his ϕJ , and declarer was in dummy again – right where he didn't want to be.

Desperately, declarer played the ♥10, letting it ride. Joel ducked. Next came the ♥Q. Again, Joel ducked. Dummy was all clubs at that point, so declarer played the ace and another club. Joel won the 10, cashed the ♥A, dropping declarer's king, and played a heart to Jill's jack. She cashed the ♣K for the setting trick.

Had North ducked the ◆K at trick one, nine tricks would have been easy. He could win the diamond return (best) in dummy, take the spade finesse and finish with five spades, three diamonds and at least a heart or a club.

The Facts: 4Ψ made four, plus 420 for E/W. The opening lead was a low heart. The Director was called after the 4Ψ bid. East said he liked his spade holding and his maximum for 2NT followed by 3Ψ so he bid 4Ψ . The Director ruled that it was easy to construct normal minimum doubles where 4Ψ and 3Φ are both going down, so pass was a logical alternative and bidding may have been suggested by the break in tempo. The contract was changed to 3Φ down two, plus 200 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. N/S, through a misunderstanding, did not attend the hearing. Prior to bidding 4♥, East suggested his opponents call the Director because of his partner's slow pass. E/W have played for 10-15 years in China, but only have 450 and 300 ACBL masterpoints. East believed South's 3♠ bid improved his hand, since West would now have only a doubleton or maybe a singleton spade. East said West would be very unlikely to have only three hearts for his double, which is why he bid 4♥ and not 4♠.

The Panel Decision: The expert players consulted all would have bid 4Ψ , or at least an invitational 3Ψ , after the double. Three believed that 4Φ was the bid called for on this auction, even with the break in tempo. One, however, thought that once East evaluated his hand as a bust initially, West's slow pass gave too much information and that pass was a logical alternative. The Panel decided that there was a 20-30 second hesitation after the 3Φ bid. Pass was a logical alternative and the break in tempo demonstrably suggested the 4Ψ bid. Law 73F1 requires that an adjustment be given under this finding. The contract was changed to 3Φ down two, plus 200 for E/W (Laws 16A2 and 12C2).

The Facts: 6♠ made six, plus 980 for E/W. The Director was called after the 5♣ bid. There was disagreement about the timing of the double (15-20)

seconds). E/W were playing negative doubles only through 3\(\daggeredge. The Director ruled that pass was a logical alternative for East and changed the contract to 4\(\nabla\) doubled down one, plus 100 for E/W.

The Appeal: E/W appealed the Director's ruling. In screening, all four players agreed that there had been a 15-20 second hesitation (total time). East believed the double of 4♥ showed values and not necessarily a trump stack. He based this on the fact that he held the ♥A. That being the case, he believed that with his powerful hand, his side would be safe at the five-level and had a possible slam. E/Wcited a recent article in the ACBL Bulletin where Rich Colker stated that in auctions involving high level preempts, longer breaks in tempo were to be expected. They did not believe that the break in tempo was that significant in this situation. East had approximately 1500 masterpoints, West 400.

The Panel Decision: The expert players consulted were all of the opinion that it was correct for East to pass West's double. One said, "What else can I do?" The Panel decided that East had violated Law 16. The contract was changed to 4♥ doubled down one, plus 100 for E/W. The Panel decided that this appeal lacked substantial merit and E/W were assigned an Appeal Without Merit Penalty Point. The Panel also considered a procedural penalty for violation of Law 73C which states that a player must "carefully avoid taking any advantage that might accrue to his side" when in receipt of unauthorized information. The Panel did not assess a procedural penalty due to the experience level of the players involved.

"I lead a totally different life at home. My life at home is not centered on bridge. Most of my close woman friends aren't even bridge players.

"I don't even play a lot of bridge – world championships, Trials, North American Championships and an occasional Sunday Swiss near home."

The most important person in her life is her husband, Sid Brownstein. "He's a great husband and he's my biggest fan and supporter. But today I'm so happy for him – he was on the team that upset Rita Shugart's team in the Vanderbilt. Personally I think he's the nicest guy on earth."

Mark Itabashi, who was sitting nearby during the interview, added, "Sid's just a great guy. He's almost always smiling."

Back in Los Angeles, Meyers runs her own business. She has a law degree, but she has never practiced. Instead she negotiates music rights. She works with movies, commercials, sound track, albums and television. Among the soundtracks she has done are Forrest Gump, Good Will Hunting and the last five Woody Allen movies. She took care of the music for the Burger King set of commercials that featured music.

Why is Meyers successful at everything she tries? "I have the right frame of mind," she said. "I feel I can do anything, and I'm not afraid of anybody. I work very hard at enhancing the things I do well. And I don't give anyone the power over me."

Then she smiled and added, "As I said, I'm not afraid of anybody. But I'm afraid of insects."

Meyers works very hard to stay in shape. "I exercise a lot, and I take a lot of vitamins. I have tremendous stamina."

Her next goal is to qualify for the World Women's Team Olympiad that will take place in Maastricht, the Netherlands, in late August. She will play in the Women's Trials in Raleigh NC in May with Lynn Baker, Karen McCallum, Tobi Sokolow, Randi Montin and Janice Seamon-Molson.

The list of top woman players includes three other Americans in the top seven. Sokolow is fifth, Shawn Quinn is sixth, and Lynn Deas is seventh. Auken is second, with Bep Vriend of the Netherlands second and Daniela von Arnim of Germany third.

The point system is set up in such a way that recent performance counts most. A certain percentage of the points of each player is deducted each year, so a player has to stay on top of his or her game to stay among the leaders.

Congrats to Robson, Shugart and Forrester-Helgemo for winning the last 16 sessions of NABC BAM competition.

Next, the Bull wandered out into the North Atlantic and stood in proud 21 Longhorn salute as Nickell, in perhaps the most dominating Bermuda Bowl performance ever, brought home the gold for dear of U.S. of A.

On the gender-restricted side, a perfectly wonderful Dutch ladies team had their one-half IMP victory over a valiant U.S. women's squad tainted by a match-deciding slow-play penalty imposed despite the failure of the WBF to keep time in any reasonable way.

This fact so depressed the Bull that he slipped into a vodka-induced stupor his last night in Bermuda. Along came a gale force wind and the Bull was blown clear away into the ocean before being rescued by the Orbis patrol boat. What a tournament the Bermudans and Orbis put on. Too bad the time-keepers did not keep time!

Here is the story of the 2000 Vanderbilt, as Shugart left the scene in the unusually early round of 32, followed in the round of 16 by the defenders (Jacobs) and No. 6 Baze.

#1 MOSS V. #8 SCHWARTZ.

Moss-Fallenius and Lindkvist-Fredin put away the defending champion Jacobs squad, while Schwartz-Casen, Zia-Rosenberg and Levin-Weinstein defeated the fairly recently formed Rose Johnson squad. Watch for the Rose to bloom in the late Anaheim summer. The four-handed Moss is tired while Richie "the Horse" puts himself in in a tight fourth quarter and wins by 5.

#2 NICKELL V. #7 MOHAN

Nickell survived a close match against a brand new Coleman, while Mohan stayed ahead the whole way in a close match against Milner. The Bermuda Bowl champs Meckwell, Soloway-Hamman and Nick and Dick go into their winter hibernation and Mohan-Lev, Shivdasani-Murthy, Gawrys-Pszczola pull out the upset of the day as Mohan knocks out the tournament favorite by 4.

#3 WOLFF V. #6 SOSLER

Wolff-Morse, Ekeblad-Sutherlin and Wildavsky-Stakgold had their way against the upstart Quinn, while Sosler, with the last female (Kay Schulle, partnered by Captain Gerald) and joined by Italian stalwarts, Lanzarotti-Buratti, defeated Captain Tip and the Polish Skis. Stakgold remembers a deal from 1958 and double squeezes home 6NT to win by 8. Four-handed is too tough.

#5 ROBINSON VERSUS #4 CAYNE

Last year's Vanderbilt finalist, Kamil-Becker, Woolsey-Stewart, and Boyd-Robinson, held their opponents to 19 IMPs in three quarters of play last night, while Cayne-Burger, Passell-Seamon, Lair-Smith, had to be rescued by the President and Chuckles — again. In the closest match of the day, the Little People catch the Mikes (Seamon and Passell) for 500 with a two-card double converted to penalty and Robinson wins by 1.

Well-traveled players earn 49er Pairs victory

It takes Geraldine Robson and James Rash an hour and a half to drive to Cincinnati, so they haven't been playing in the evening sessions at the Spring NABC. They made an exception Wednesday for the two-session 49er Pairs – and it was a good decision.

Robson, from East Liberty OH, and Rash, of Bellefontaine OH, came through in fine form, winning the event by about half a board. The two, who almost never play duplicate, will have their names inscribed on the Fifth Chair Trophy, donated by the Fifth Chair Foundation, which is dedicated to mentoring and encouraging new players.

Robson, known to friends as Gerry, is attending her first tournament – and she's having a ball.

the tournament, added a silver ribbon to her collection by finishing second in partnership with Fred Hamilton. Another half a board back in third place were William Esberg and Marla Chaikin.

Chazen has won this event once before – in 1973. That was another last-minute arrangement – just as the game was getting under way he paired up with Marilyn Johnson – another prize-winning combination. Altogether Chazen has won five North American championships, the most recent being the Senior Knockouts last fall in Boston.

1987 was the big year for Gordon. She won her first NABC title in the IMP Pairs with Robb Gordon in Baltimore. Then later that year at the Anaheim NABC, Linda and Robb were married at the tournament.

Robb wasn't here to congratulate his wife last night. He recently became a governor of the American Stock Exchange and as a result couldn't afford the time away from his new responsibilities.

Gordon has a most amusing recollection of her early history with Chazen. "We met at a San Francisco bridge club, and he invited me to dinner," said Gordon. "We were supposed to meet at 5, and I waited until 8. He never showed up. I didn't talk to him for the next 10 years."

When Chazen met Linda's mother, he told her, "You're meeting the only man who ever stood your daughter up."

Linda's mother was up for that remark. She retorted, "That's what you think!" Chazen is now a journalist – he does two bridge newsletters – Bridge Sense

and Aces Bridge Monthly. He also runs bridge cruises, and there's still a little time left over for teaching and lecturing.

Gordon retired last year after working as a school guidance counselor for 33 years. "I'm a lady of leisure now," she said.

Gordon had more to worry about than just whether or not Chazen would lose in the Vanderbilt soon enough. She also had a problem on her way to Cincinnati. Just before she got on the plane, she bought a snack. When she felt something funny in her mouth while she was eating her snack, she discovered it was part of one of her teeth. But she got her mouth fixed and was ready to play.

"Well," mused the former world champion, "if they open 1NT and you overcall 24 (showing a one-suiter) and you go for a number, it's Cappelletti. If you get a good result, it's Hamilton."
