Kirsch, Kleinplatz lead Silver Ribbon quals

Local players Sheldon Kirsch and Morrie Kleinplatz turned in the best performance in yesterday's qualifying round of the Leventritt Silver Ribbon Pairs. Kirsch, of West Bloomfield MI, and Kleinplatz, of Windsor ON, posted a 61.31% in the afternoon session and a 65.08% in the evening to lead the field by more than a board. Their two-session total with carryover was 821.5 (top = 25).

In second with 790.5 are the Arizona-based pair of Ken Barbour and Markland Jones.

Of the 178 pairs that entered the two-day contest, 104 qualified for the final round.

The Silver Ribbon Pairs is limited to players 55 and older who have qualified for the event.

Vanderbilt Teams begin head-to-head matches

The first day of the Vanderbilt Knockouts saw the field of 75 entrants reduced to the magic 64 by the following path: The top 31 seeds had byes, while the remaining 44 squads played four-way matches. Each of these matches produced three winners, or 33 teams. 31 + 33 = 64.

Head-to-head matches begin today.

Said moves past 30,000 MPs

Grand Life Master Chuck Said has more than 30,000 masterpoints, placing him number 13 on ACBL's all-time list. Said has won numerous NABC events including the Senior Knockout Teams three times and the Silver Ribbon Pairs once. He also has



several second-place finishes including the North American Pairs, earlier in this tournament.

Said came to the U.S. from Iran in the late Fifties to go to college. He had always liked card games and learned how to play bridge in

a pickup game. When he moved to Ann Arbor MI, he watched students play and soon was invited to join when they needed a fourth.

"The first time I played, I passed a takeout double and then I passed Blackwood," said Said. After playing for a while, however, he steadily began to improve. "I started playing with the better players such as Ron Gerard."

Eventually he improved enough to begin teaching bridge. "I taught through an Adult Education Program at the University of Michigan," said Said. "The director of the program offered to sponsor me so I could get a green card." This eventually allowed Said to become an American citizen.

Said began to play full-time. "Back then there weren't that many full-time players," said Said. "There was Paul Soloway, Jim Jacoby, J. David King, Gaylor Kasle, and that was about it," he said. Several of his partners were in the South, and Said eventually moved to Nashville TN, where he now lives.

Atlanta Youth NABC promises fun in July

The first North American Bridge Championships exclusively for players 19 and under will be held July 3-6 in Atlanta. This exciting tournament will feature the two-session

Baron Barclay National Youth Open Pairs (with \$2000 in scholarship prizes) and the National Youth Swiss Teams (with \$1000 in scholarship prizes provided by District 7), along with many single-session games for less experienced players.

Hundreds of young people from across ACBL are expected to attend, said tournament organizer Patty Tucker.

"This will be a fun event for kids and their families. Most of our participants are 10-15 years

old, and have played only a few years at the most. But they'll get to meet many of their age peers in Atlanta, and play the whole tournament against kids their own age," she said.

Tucker hopes the tournament will also interest adults in starting classes in their own areas.

"We've had a great response from kids everywhere, including Iowa, Illinois, Colorado and even Hawaii. Some groups

are even holding fund raisers to help kids and their families attend."

Matchpoint plays

This deal (from the first final session of the Silodor Open Pairs) would be very dull in 4♠ at teams: You'd claim 10 tricks and move on. But at pairs, how would you play 4♠ by South (1♦-1♠; 2NT-4♠) on the lead of the ♥Q?

You need to try to set up diamonds or ruff a club, but your chances of doing either may not seem good. In fact, you need a miracle in diamonds or a singleton ♠8 or ♠A. You cash the ♥A K to pitch a diamond, then play the ♦A and ruff a diamond before ducking a club. The best East can do is shift to a trump, and West can win and return a trump. The ♠7 in dummy lets declarer win and ruff a diamond, draw the last trump and use the ♣A as the entry for the established diamonds.

An initial club lead sets 5♠; declarer ducks and the defense shifts to trumps, playing two rounds of the suit to remove an entry to dummy prematurely.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

Five-five, come alive!

The first two-suited bid many of us learn is the jump to four of a major after partner has opened 1♥ or 1♠. This bid promises more than just five-card support. It also has a singleton or void and another source of tricks.

Say partner opens 1♠ and you hold
♠A9872 ♥753 ♦K83 ♣92.

A meek 2♠ raise is more than enough. Change the hand to
♠A9872 ♥7 ♦K9873 ♣92, however, and the trick-taking potential zooms upward because of the side five-card suit.

A lusty jump to 4♠ is in order. Two-suited hands present bidding challenges, but they are also exciting with lots of potential for taking tricks. If partner doesn't have a fit for your first suit, you have an alternative to offer. If partner does support your first suit, you have another source of tricks. Be optimistic and aggressive in your bidding.

Suppose you hold:
♠KJ942 ♥6 ♦AQ987 ♣K2. You have only 13 high-card points, but if partner raises your 1♠ opening to 2♠, try game in spades. The odds are excellent that you'll be able to develop 10 tricks.

When you use the Rule of 20, you are recognizing the strength of a two-suited hand. There is no point, by the way, in trying to use this evaluation method with one-suited hands. It's a poor tool for that purpose. A little common sense never hurts, though. Compare this hand:

♠KJ942 ♥6 ♦AQ987 ♣82
with
♠J9742 ♥K ♦98754 ♣AQ.

Clearly, it's better to open the first hand than the second one, though they have the same pattern and high cards. There is a guideline for these cases called in-and-out valuation. You want the high cards in a Rule of 20 hand to be in the long suits. If you have 12 or 13 HCP, you'd probably open no matter where the points are, but a little self-preservation never hurts when you are considering opening a hand with fewer than 12 HCP.

If the opponents open, there are a variety of

strategies for showing 5-5 hands. One of the most popular is the unusual notrump, usually a jump, to show 5-5 in the minor suits (over a major suit) or, for some partnerships, 5-5 in the two lowest unbid suits if the opponent has opened a minor.

In fourth seat, if the opponents have opened 1♦ and there has been a 1♥ response, the unusual notrump would be used to show the unbid suits — clubs and spade in this case. If the opponent opens 1NT and you overcall 2NT, what could be more unusual? You have 5-5 in the minors. The unusual notrump is familiar enough to most players that it does not require an Alert.

The Michaels cuebid also shows a 5-5 hand. Over a minor-suit opening, the cuebid promises both majors. Over a major-suit opening, you promise the other major and a minor. If partner wants to know which minor you have, 2NT is the most common way to ask. Michaels does not require an Alert.

Some partnerships use two-suited bids with all point count ranges, but a more popular approach is to restrict them to two bidding situations: With very weak hands, say when you are not vulnerable and the opponents are, or with superior hands of 16 or more points. Look at the following two hands:

♠K9752 ♥QJ1096 ♦4 ♣32,
and

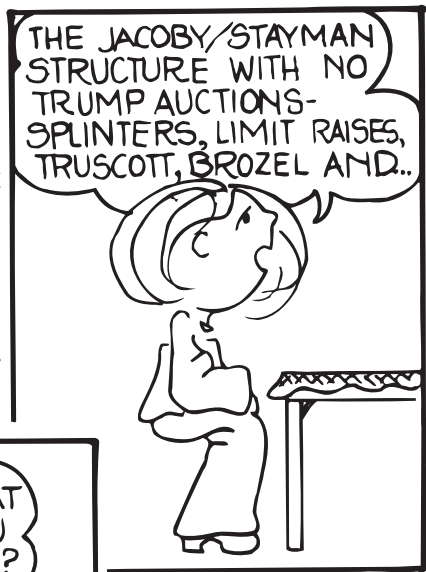
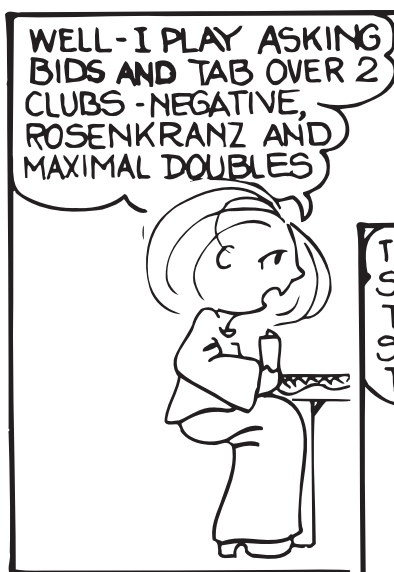
Play commentary: With a certain club loser, South needs to find East with the ♠Q, so the ♠J is led from dummy at trick two.

Defensive commentary #2: As East in second seat, do not cover the jack! When dummy has two equal honors, *cover the second equal, not the first.* Notice the difference. If the jack is covered, declarer wins, crosses back to the 10, sees West show out and leads a low spade to the 8. You take zero spade

♠AQJ72 ♥KQJ96 ♦A ♣32.
You would use the Michaels cuebid over 1♣ with either hand, and pass whatever partner bids with the first, but at least raise his major-suit preference with the second.

tricks. If you duck the jack, but cover the 10, declarer wins, partner shows out, but declarer cannot get back to dummy to finesse you out of your ♠94. Success! You wind up with a spade and a club trick.

As second hand, when dummy has a number of equal honors, cover the last equal. This is an important defensive principle.

Bidding commentary: After North cuebids the ♥A, South decides to give up on a grand slam as it is tough to discover if partner has both black queens.

Defensive commentary: In spite of the heart cuebid, East's powerful heart sequence warrants a heart lead.

Taking advantage of opportunities

Robert Lebi and Dan Jacob won the four-session Silidor Open Pairs that ended Saturday evening. They earned almost all the matchpoints on this deal (rotated) from the second final session, when Jacob took full advantage of the opponents' bidding to make a lead-directing double for Lebi:

The double, of course, asked for the lead of dummy's first suit, hearts. Lebi obediently led the ♥9, and the defense soon scored two hearts tricks and a heart ruff. Although careful play will allow declarer to escape for down one, declarer dropped another trick late in the play. That, along with the ♣A, left declarer down two.

Plus 300 was good for 76.5 out of a possible 77 matchpoints for the winners.

Virtue is its own reward

If North-South were left to their own devices, it is not easy for them to reach their optimal spot, which is a club partscore. There is nothing wrong with 5♣, except that it doesn't make!

But where West opens an undisciplined (feel free to substitute your own adjective!) weak two-bid, the auction might very well go Pass-2♠-Dbl-3♠; 4♥-All Pass. How should you play 4♥ on the lad of the ♠Q?

Clearly, you need 3-3 trumps, so win the ♠A, pitching a diamond, and knock out a club honor. Ruff the spade return and knock out the other club honor. When a spade comes back, ruff, cash the ♥K Q, cross to the ♦A, play the master trump and take the rest. (If you want to protect yourself a little, you can pitch a diamond on the third spade. That holds you to 10 tricks.)

As a separate issue, how should you play 4♥ on the lead of the ♦J? If you take the ace, you must immediately cash the ♠A to pitch a diamond, but then the defenders can tap you out successfully. If, however, you cover the ♦J with the queen, you still have the communication to set up the clubs.
