Meltzer wins Open BAM in photo finish

The Open Board-a-Match Teams was decided by the narrowest of margins — .01 — as the reigning Bermuda Bowl champions captained by Rose Meltzer held on to claim victory in the two-day event.

The team of Meltzer, Kyle Larsen, Peter Weichsel, Alan Sontag, Lew Stansby and Chip Martel posted a final score of 40.08 to squeak past the international squad of George Jacobs, Ralph Katz, Alfredo Versace, Lorenzo Lauria, Giorgio Duboin and Norberto Bocchi. The Jacobs team scored 40.07.

Two other teams were also extremely close. In third with 39.29 was the squad of David Lehman, Dick Melson, Sharon Osberg and Mark Feldman. The fourth-place team of Richard Schwartz, Michael Becker, Larry Cohen, David Berkowitz, Michael Rosenberg and Zia Mahmood scored 39.11.

In what was one of the closest finishes ever in an NABC event, the top four teams finished less than one board apart.

Eythorsdottir team takes Women's BAM

The squad of Hjordis Eythorsdottir, Valerie Westheimer, Rozanne Pollack and Carol Simon outscored a powerful field to claim victory in the four-session Women's Board-a-Match Teams. The foursome led throughout much of the two-session final.

The winners posted a final tally of 35.90 to finish a half board ahead of the powerhouse squad of Lynn Deas, Beth Palmer, Kerri Sanborn, Irina Levitina, Randi Montin and Jill Meyers who scored 35.40.

In third with 34.10 was the team of Petra Hamman, Joan Jackson, Mildred Breed, Shawn Quinn, Judi Radin and Sylvia Moss.

The winners scored 18.5 out of 27 in the afternoon session and 16.5 out of 24 in the evening session. The back-to-back nearly-69% sessions lifted the team to the win.

The members of the Eythorsdottir's team have each previously won multiple NABC events.

Forty teams participated in the final.

Eight teams advanced to action in today's Senior Knockouts. The only upset in yesterday's matches was the contest between the #3 seed, the team captained by Gary Yant, and the #14 seed, led by Ed Lazarus. Lazarus ousted Yant 155–39 in three quarters of play.

The #5 seed, Harris, trailed throughout the first half of its match with #12, Hardy, but came back in the second half to win 156–100.

Today's matches are #1 Budd vs. #8 Weed, #4 Bennett vs. #5 Harris, #3 Lazarus vs. #6 Gabriel and #2 Levine vs. #7 Onstott.

Attendance racing at record pace

54 foreigners made Open BAM final

As the results were processed for the qualifiers in the Open Board-a-Match Teams, it was discovered that a record-breaking number of foreign players made the final. Altogether there were 54 players from 14 countries outside ACBLand.

When we asked a few people which country they thought had the most, the answers usually were Poland, Italy and Sweden. Wrong! The biggest contingent was from England – 13. The next largest was from Iceland – eight.

Other nations: Italy 6, Sweden 5, Poland 4, Norway 4, Turkey 4, China 3, Russia 2, Australia 2, France 1, Ireland 1, Israel 1.

It was quite a surprise to see no one from Japan since there are more than 30 Japanese playing at this tournament.

Matthews is Caddy Master, "Step Mom"

The job of staffing and supervising the small army of caddies that are necessary to run a successful NABC is a daunting task, which is why the ACBL relies heavily on the experience of Jackie Matthews.

Matthews is a tournament director whose task at the NABCs for the past 16 years has been to train, organize, support and even play step-mom to the dozens of young men and women who serve as NABC caddies.

"We try to make it fun for them," said Matthews, who likens the caddies she's known over the years to an extended family.

"I feel like I've raised many of these kids, because a lot of them work at the NABCs for several years in a row and I get to see them three times a year."

Many of the caddies at the North American championships work at the events because their parents play the game. The caddy job is a win-win scenario for parents and their teenaged children. Parents don't have to worry about where their children are, it gives the kids something to do to keep them occupied and they

John P. (Jock) Roberts

John Roberts died on Oct. 27 in New York City at the age of 56. He had been battling various forms of cancer for some time. A memorial service will be held on Dec. 11 at 2:30 p.m. at the Congregation Rodeph Sholom, 7 West 83rd St., New York City.

Roberts is best remembered in the bridge world as the original organizer of the Cavendish Pairs, the invitational event that now gives out prizes totaling more than \$1 million annually.

Outside of bridge he is best known for coming to the aid of the first Woodstock just when it seemed the project would founder because of lack of funds. He authorized the use of \$2.4 million from his trust fund to enable Woodstock to take place. He also was a board member of Outward Bound.

One of the most popular bridge players, he especially enjoyed playing with partners like Vic and Jacqui Mitchell, George Tornay, Augie Boehm, his brother Bill, Tom Smith, David Berkowitz and John Solodar.

He and his brother Bill finished third in the Life Master Pairs. He won the Reisinger Knockout Teams in New York twice, and he represented District 24 (New York City area) twice in the Grand National Teams.

He is survived by his wife Rona and two children, Jennifer and Douglas.

Approved defenses to Mid-Chart methods

Players who use methods allowed under the Mid-Chart (permitted in NABC+ events, unrestricted Flight A regionally rated and any bracket of a bracketed KO which contains no team with a bracket designator of less than 1000 masterpoints) are responsible for providing an approved defense from the online ACBL Defense database to those methods.

Since this regulation just recently went into effect, copies of the approved defenses may be available at the supply tables (while supplies last). In the future, players will be responsible for downloading these defenses prior to the events in which they are to be used.

If you want to play Mid-Chart methods, download the appropriate defenses in advance.

Smoking policy

This is Las Vegas, so smoking regulations are very lenient in hotels and casinos. But remember that once you cross into the convention area of the Hilton, you are in ACBL country and there is no smoking in the playing areas or pre-function areas. If you are playing in any Pavilion room or the Barron or Conrad rooms, the fastest smoking access is outside on the patio. Those playing in the ballroom may want to head toward the casino for a smoking break.

How an expert figures the hand

Piotr Gawrys and Jacek Pszczola won the four-session Life Master Open Pairs that ended Monday evening. It was the first NABC victory for each, although they have multiple wins in high-level international events.

Here are the Poles in action on Board 1 of the first final session:

South led the ♦6 (third- and fifth-best leads). Declarer, Gawrys, paused to consider the inferences available from the auction and the opening lead.

The ♦6 looked very much like third-best, suggesting that South had led from a four-card suit. Since South made a preemptive raise in diamonds, North was more likely to hold length in the majors (South didn't bid 1♠ or make a negative double). With diamonds likely 4-4, North was marked for club shortness. If the diamond trick were won in dummy in order to play a trump toward the closed hand, North might well rise with the ace and shoot a club through. The club ruff would be obvious to South at that point. Even if declarer were to immediately cash the high diamonds to pitch one of the clubs, South would win the ♣A on the first round of the suit and play another club anyway. Despite the fact that North can be overruffed, declarer, with a minimum of two black-suit losers and at least two trump losers, will find himself a trick short in the ending.

So Gawrys won the opening lead with the ♦A and made the key play of a low club. South flew with the ace, but could not be sure who held the singleton club. South then shifted to a low spade, and the defensive club ruff was no longer available.

Gawrys held up the ♠A one round, crossed to the high diamonds and shook a club. The ♣K was next, ruffed by North's ♥3, overruffed with the ♥4. This was the position:

Declarer re-entered the dummy with a spade ruff and played the ♣Q. Whether North ruffed this or not was immaterial as Gawrys had already managed to hold his losers to four: one spade, one club and two trumps.

Plus 140 earned the winners 70% of the matchpoints.

Bless me, Father, for I have sinned

Mea culpa, mea culpa, mea maxima culpa. During the Tuesday evening game I made a series of small errors, each of which cost blood. Bear with me while I confess my sins and seek absolution.

Like most of the field we reached 3NT. I had opened 1NT with the East cards. South led a heart from what appeared to be a five-card suit, and I decided to play North for club length. That being so, I decided to play a club to the ace at once. Wrong!

Now I was struggling for nine tricks. Fortunately cashing three spades triple squeezed South into pitching a heart. Now I could play on diamonds to set up my ninth trick for a miserable plus 600. The point is that once South pitches his fifth heart, he only has two hearts to go with his ♦A-K to cash.

That was good enough for a win, surprisingly enough. Teammates Debbie Rosenberg and Marty Fleisher went plus against 3NT – I guess there are some players out there worse than me.

The entry position is very tangled. It is best, I believe, to win the ♥A and cash the ♠A-K-J. Then when South pitches a heart, assume he has club length and lead the ♣K out of your hand. This assures 10 tricks.

OK. Next penance.

We conducted a reasonably efficient auction to 3NT after our North opened 1♦. South led the ♠Q and I could see that North had the balance of the high cards. I cashed four diamonds at once and now made the huge error of playing the ♥A. Now I could not cash four hearts to strip squeeze North and endplay him in spades to lead clubs for me.

It is far better to play hearts before diamonds. Since North appears to have six spades, he can't have four hearts, can he?

My teammates covered me again, though. They were minus 300 in 3♠. I guess their opponents did not have any red cards in their bidding box . . .

The final installment of my confessions.

We reached 3NT as East-West here. I suppose I'll have to admit that I overcalled 2♠ as East over a weak 2♥ .

On the ♥9 lead I ducked, then won the second heart. I led the ♣10 which held. What next? I led to the ♦10, losing to the jack – down three. Compare the effect of

Crossed up

Andy Stark of NY reported the following deal, featuring a criss-cross squeeze, from the second qualifying session of the Open Board-a-Match Teams. Stark was playing with partner Diana Tenary.

Stark, South, won the opening lead of the ♦A and ruffed a diamond. A low club was played from dummy and East accurately rose with the ace, but then fell from grace by playing a third round of diamonds (a trump or a club is better).

Stark ruffed in dummy with the queen and played dummy's last spade, capturing East's bare king. Declarer now ran all the trumps. Here's the position when the last trump is played:

When Stark played the ♠2, West discarded the ♦Q, and the ♥Q was pitched from dummy. East had no answer to this: if he discarded a heart, declarer would cross to the ♥A, cross back to the ♣K and enjoy the last heart. If East instead let go of a club, declarer would cash the ♣K, cross to the ♥A and cash the good ♣J.

For correctly executing the criss-cross squeeze, Stark made 12 tricks and a win on the board since the declarer at the other table made only 11 tricks in spades.

Goodwill message

How pleasant it is to hear a player call, "Director, please" – instead of a shouted "DIRECTOR!"

Why not extend the same courtesy to our caddies? Don't you think "Caddy, please" has a rather nice sound?

Remember that Las Vegas is the first NABC for some of our players – and it's also the first NABC for many of our caddies.

Here's Kantar's solution:

With a singleton in both hands a crossruff looks best but with the trump switch you can count only nine tricks, seven trump tricks plus two aces. In order to come to 10 tricks, win the trump return in dummy and immediately take the club finesse. When this works, cash the ♣A and play the hand as a straight crossruff.

The Facts: 2♥ made two, +110 for N/S. The opening lead was the ♣A. The Director was called at the end of the auction. South did not know if 2♥ was forcing, and was not going to pass 2♦ with a void. West said that he would have bid 2♠ if he had known 2♥ was non-forcing. The Director changed the contract to 2♠ made two, +110 for E/W (Laws 21B3, 40C, 12C2).

The Appeal: N/S appealed the Director's ruling. South said he didn't think about whether or not 2♥ was forcing. He never considered passing with a diamond void. North said he knew they were playing Ogust, didn't know if they had discussed if new suits were forcing. He decided to pass since he was minimum with only one heart. South said 2♠ couldn't be the final contract because he would have balanced with 3♣.

N/S accepted that 3♣ might not buy the contract, but they certainly wouldn't sell out to 2♠. E/W said West is very aggressive and would definitely have bid 2♠. They were willing to cite other hands as examples if necessary. They believed they were owed an Alert if North was treating 2♥ as non-forcing. E/W asked about the 2♥ bid before the opening lead. North said they hadn't really discussed it, but he thought it might be non-forcing because they were playing Ogust.

The Panel Decision: This case potentially had several issues to address, but all hinged on whether there had been an infraction. South's CC was marked Ogust. The red box marked "New Suit NF" was not checked. North had lost his CC. There was no dispute that North had, in fact, said at the table that they hadn't really discussed if new suits were forcing.

The Panel was satisfied that there had not been a violation of Law. Law 40B states "A player may not make a call . . . unless his side discloses the use of such call or play in accordance with the regulations of the sponsoring organization." No agreement of "New Suit NF" existed and therefore E/W were not due an Alert. Thus all other issues became moot. The table result of 2♥ made two, +110 for N/S was restored.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time. When making an announcement, use the announcement word -- such as "transfer" -- and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or announces a bid should make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or announcement has been made.

Will Blue Ribbon be another squeaker?

Richard Coren and Marc Jacobus won a squeaker in last year's Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, edging Steve Weinstein and Robert Levin by a margin of 7.53 matchpoints. Top on a board was 31.

Coren and Jacobus posted a final score of 966.70 to 959.17 for Weinstein and Levin. Bob Hamman and Zia Mahmood were third while Larry Cohen and David Berkowitz were fourth, only a single point behind.

Jacobus, a bridge professional who lives in Las Vegas, won his fourth North American championship while Coren, a Fort Lauderdale attorney, claimed his first.

Coren (West) opened 1NT and bought the contract. North led a low heart to the jack and Coren's king. Coren immediately (smoothly too, according to Jacobus) led the ♦K to the 8, 2 and queen. He continued with a low diamond to the 9, 10 and jack. South returned a heart and North cashed four heart tricks.

When North led the ♠10, Coren won dummy's ace and continued with a low spade, finessing his jack. He cashed the ♠K and exited with a diamond. North finally won his ace and was forced to break clubs. Coren finished down one for minus 100 and almost all the matchpoints.

The event

The Blue Ribbon Pairs ranks with the Life Master Pairs as the most prestigious -- and toughest -- pair events on the ACBL calendar. Like the LM Pairs, the Blue Ribbon Pairs is played over three days and includes two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions.

Entry is restricted to winners and runners-up in regional championships -- plus high finishers in North American championships, members of current Grand National district championship teams, members of current official teams representing ACBL and the top 100 lifetime masterpoint holders.

The Blue Ribbon Pairs was renamed the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1999 to honor one of bridge's all-time great players, writers, administrators and the authority on the laws of the game.

Kaplan (1925-1997) won his first North American championship in 1953 -- the Vanderbilt -- and his last in 1997 -- the Open Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Dallas.

Kaplan was recognized as the world's foremost authority on the laws of duplicate and rubber bridge. He became co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission in 1978 and was co-chairman of the WBF Laws Commission at the time of his death.

He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1993. In 1995 he was inducted into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame and the WBF Hall of Fame.

The trophy

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy, awarded for the National Open Pair Championship and donated by the Cavendish Club of New York in 1928. Since 1963, the trophy has been awarded to winners of

the Blue Ribbon Pairs.



get paid for their efforts.

Caddies are paid \$25 per session. Each session is about four and a half hours long, from the pre-game setup to post-game clean-up.

The caddies are an invaluable resource to tournament organizers, who typically use four caddies for every 100 tables. Here in Las Vegas, Matthews supervises a crew of 72 caddies.

But the relationship between Matthews and the caddies is more maternal than managerial.

"It's amazing how many of these kids have touched my life over the years," she said.

A declarer from the Tuesday afternoon regional pair game certainly couldn't complain of bad luck on this deal:

Declarer, South, found himself in the somewhat dubious contract of 6♠. The opening heart lead went to the king and ace. Declarer unblocked dummy's ♣A, ruffed a low diamond in the closed hand and cashed the ♣K Q, pitching dummy's remaining hearts.

East, however, ruffed (!) the third round of clubs with the ♦7 and immediately returned the ♦J establishing the revoke.

After the director was summoned, play continued. When declarer regained the lead and played a trump, the ♠K and now-singleton ♠A crashed. With the two-trick penalty for the revoke, however, the result was scored as 6♠ making seven. An overtrick in a small slam, missing the ace-king of trumps!

Nadine's tuna

Nadine Wood's tuna fish salad is what participants in the Women's Team Trials ask for more than any food.

The recipe is on page 111 in *Apres Bridge Yummies*, a \$10 cookbook and fund raiser for the 2002 Summer NABC in Washington DC. Nadine and other District 6 folk can usually be found near the entry-selling areas at the Hilton.

Here's the tuna recipe:

- 12 oz. can tuna in water
- 3 stalks celery, chopped
- 4 green onions, chopped
- 1 Tbl. Sweet pickle relish
- 1 Tbl. lemon juice
- Salt
- Pepper
- Mayonnaise

Squeeze water out of tuna can, then squeeze tuna by hand a little at a time to make sure water is out. Put in bowl and add celery, onions, pickle relish with only a little liquid and lemon juice. Add salt and pepper to taste. Add two big spoons of mayonnaise and mix thoroughly. Add more mayonnaise until it is of good consistency -- moist but not runny.

**The Golden Anniversary
of the Pill**

Fifty years ago, an event occurred that changed the course of life for millions around the world. On October 15, 1951, George Rosenkranz and his workers at Syntex invented the Pill.

Rosenkranz, known to the bridge players of the world as the inventor of the Romex System, is recognized by the rest of the world as the inventor of the Pill. He has been honored twice recently on this golden anniversary, once by Universidad Nacional Automa, the oldest university in America, and once by the Ministry of Health. He addressed both groups, giving a synopsis of how the Pill came to be.

The man who synthesized the active chemical ingredient of what was to become the birth control pill was Luis Miramontes, working under Rosenkranz's direction in the Syntex lab. The third key member of the team was Carl Dierassi. All three are members of the Inventors Hall of Fame as a result of their work on the Pill. "Contrary to popular belief," said Rosenkranz, "this was not the result of serendipity. Instead it was the culmination of a long chain of purposeful, planned events having a solid biological and chemical foundation."

Apart from convincing Edith to marry him and bringing up a loving family of three wonderful sons, it is the fascinating Syntex story that Rosenkranz considers his most significant achievement. "It is the success story of a small company that I guided for more than 50 years from its early years in near bankruptcy to the industrial giant that it became. We finally sold it to Roche for 5.3 billion U.S. dollars. The contributions to cortisone, synalar, the Pill, naproxen and many more vital medicines speak for themselves."

Rosenkranz still has strong scientific interests. Presently his scientific interest is focused on genomics and pheromones.

Rosenkranz, now 85, doesn't act like an 85-year-old. He is still very active both physically and mentally. "What keeps me young? A healthy body and a healthy mind. I have retained my innate scientific curiosity and I try to keep track of all significant developments. Exercise is absolutely necessary for both: brain and body.

"A recent study showed that the onset of the feared Alzheimer disease can be postponed by at least 10 years by keeping your mind busy. So vigorous mental activity like bridge, chess, crossword puzzles and reading is essential.

"Good health is imperative. Good food, a balanced diet, weight consciousness, little alcohol and of course no drugs are the most important desiderata. I work hard to try to keep my body in shape. I exercise twice a week in a gym with a trainer, weight lifting and stretching are steady parts of my program.

"I avoid stress as much as possible, just as everyone should. This applies both to life and the bridge table. Make fewer confrontations. Worries are detrimental to your health."

Rosenkranz is an inventor in bridge as well as in science. His most outstanding contribution to bridge theory is the Romex System, an ongoing evolution

"designed in the hope of challenging the domination of Italian bidding systems. It is a living system incorporating the most successful ideas of today's bridge theory."

Rosenkranz still plays top-level bridge. He led his team to a second-place finish in the prestigious Vanderbilt Knockout Teams last March, and he has had many other major successes since he has been in his eighties.

When he's defending, he thinks about the whole hand before he makes his opening lead. Look how well his opening lead worked on this deal from a recent tournament.

What did Rosenkranz know about the hand? He knew that North had exactly five hearts and at least 9 high card points and that South had exactly two hearts (he preferred notrump to hearts) and 15-17 points. If North was minimum, Rosenkranz knew his partner had some honor cards. Chances were great he had at least four spades because he was marked with no more than three and declarer most likely had no more than four.

Additionally he knew declarer had at least one four-card minor, perhaps two if he had only three spades. He reasoned that a lead in either minor suit could easily be counter-productive. For all these reasons, a spade lead looked best, so Rosenkranz put the spade 8 on the table.

Declarer won with dummy's king and played a diamond to his king. After winning with the ace, Rosenkranz returned his other spade. When he got in with the heart ace, he switched to a club. As a result the defense took five tricks before declarer could take nine – down one.

If West leads a diamond or a club, declarer establishes dummy's heart suit and gets home because of his good diamond spots. To make the contract on the actual spade lead, declarer would have to win the first trick with the king and immediately lead a club to the queen – not a very likely line of play.

Rosenkranz's new book, *Godfrey's Angels*, co-authored by Phillip Alder, should come out late this month. It is a description of Romex as played today. "We've made the reading more interesting by using the framework of Godfrey stories," said Rosenkranz.

Key Rosenkranz advice: "Keep healthy, keep in shape and enjoy bridge. Maintain an active interest in everything that is going around in the world. Keep working as long as you can. You have gained a lot of experience during the years of your life. Use it!"

Two play problems

I have just spent some time at ACBL headquarters in Memphis, working on the cataloguing and organization of the ACBL's impressive collection of books, magazines and paraphernalia. As the ACBL librarian, I can be contacted at tim.bourke@acbl.org.*) Jim Miller, who is head of ACBL Sales and is responsible for the day-to-day management of the library, gave me two challenging play problems:

Problem One: A Sure Thing

West leads the ♦K, which you ruff. The contract seems relatively easy until East discards a diamond on the ace of trumps. How do you plan to make certain of your contract?

Problem Two: Listen To The Bidding

West leads the ♥8 to your king. When you lay down ♠A, East reduces 12 sure tricks to 11 by discarding a heart. How do you plan to rescue your 12th trick?

Solution To Problem One

You could rely on the club finesse or spades 3-3. However if spades divide badly and East has the ♣K, you could run into problems by playing on the black suits:

The way to succeed against any distribution is to draw the three remaining trumps and throw a diamond from table. Then you continue with the ace and queen of clubs. If East wins and plays a second round of diamonds, you ruff and discard dummy's blocking ♦J. He fares no better if he ducks the ♣Q for you will continue with the ♣J. If he wins, you have the rest. If he ducks a second time, the top spades will provide the tricks you need for your contract.

Solution To Problem Two

Your first move should be to lead the ♠7. If West covers with the 8, dummy's jack of spades will win the trick and then your 12th trick can come only from a club-heart squeeze against East:

When you play the ♦Q, throwing a spade from dummy, East has no answer. A heart is immediately fatal while if he discards a club you will play ace-king and another club to set up your ♠7 with the ♥A as the entry to enjoy it.
