## It's a family affair: Alaskans into bridge

When the six members of the Galvin family of Anchorage AK were bumped from an airline flight earlier this year, they received vouchers for free travel to wherever they wanted to go.

Alyse Galvin knew exactly where she, husband Pat and the four children should go – and for what.

“We wouldn’t be in Orlando if not for the bridge,” said Alyse, who was standing by one day earlier in the tournament waiting for Bridget, her 7-year-old, to finish her Bridge Plus+ session.

It was well worth the wait.

Bridget and her partner, cousin Ron Wendte, had a 68% game and won easily.

Alyse said three of her four children – Bridget, 13-year-old Cooper and 11-year-old Sean – now play. Four-year-old Camden isn’t into bridge – yet.

Mom said the boys learned bridge three years ago, taught by their great uncle, Walt Pease, in an Easybridge! class.

A year after the youngsters took up the game, Alyse says, she and Pat decided they had better find out what the kids were enjoying so much.

“They were just enthralled,” says Alyse, who gives high marks to bridge because it is a “non-screen” activity – a reference to television – that provides

Baze, Gaylor Kasle, Michael Whitman and Egyptians Tarek Sadek and Walid El Ahmady finished the day’s play with 36 points, to 34.50 for the Rose Meltzer squad (Peter Weichsel, Kyle Larsen, Alan Sontag, Chip Martel and Lew Stansby).

Half a point back of Meltzer were Robert Levin, Steve Weinstein and Norwegians Tor Helness and Geir Helgemo.

### Three-way tie in Women’s BAM

Three teams finished the two qualifying sessions deadlocked for first place, and four others were nipping at their heels in the Marsh May Sternberg Women’s Board-a-Match Teams. The four-session event concludes today.

The top three teams, by captain, are Hansa Narasimhan, Pamela Granovetter and Lisa Berkowitz. They all scored 29.50. In fourth place, half a point behind, was the squad captained by Valerie Westheimer.

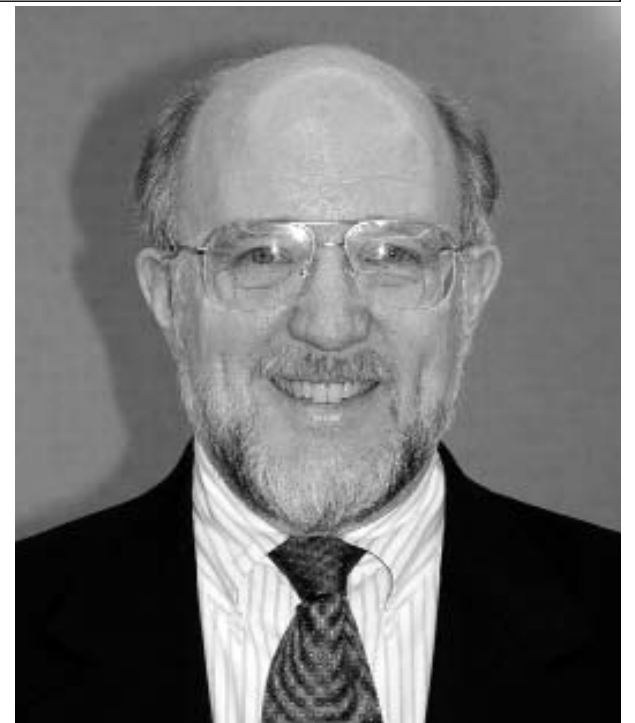
Half a point behind Westheimer were teams led by Gail Greenberg and Carlyn Steiner, and half a point behind them was the Ann Labe team.

“There is an awful lot of good going on with the ACBL,” says Smith. “Membership is up, Zero Tolerance is working, and we need to focus on the positive aspects of what’s going on in the organization. I would like to have a year to spread that message.”

Smith said he is pleased that his presidency will coincide with the 50th anniversary of the establishment of the Goodwill Committee.

“I want to celebrate that,” says Smith.

### Good news, bad news

Which do you want first – the good news or the bad news? There was plenty of both on Board 2 from the first final session of Saturday's three North American Championship events.

The good news, you say? Fine.

This was the auction when Debbie Drury of Vero Beach FL was North and Gail Nye of Palm City FL was South. With a fine fit for partner's diamonds, Nye found a bid that most players wouldn't think of – that 4♣ bid. Of course that got her partner off to the right opening lead – a club. Nye ruffed and then she made a nice play to go with her nice bid – she underled her ♦A. Drury (no relation to the author of the Drury Convention) won with the king. She cashed the ♠A to set the contract, then led another club when Nye followed to the ♠A with the deuce. That was a two-set worth all 38 matchpoints.

Deep Finesse said that the maximum in hearts against perfect defense was nine tricks. Right again!

But most declarers made a lot more tricks than that. Without the club bid, it isn't easy for North to lead a club. All that brings us to a tale of woe from Brian Senior of England, who is one of the editors for the World Bridge Federation Daily Bulletins. It is typical of Senior that he tells of how he went wrong instead of how bright he might be. This was the auction:

Senior was North and his partner was Nigel Bird, also of England.

The play was over very swiftly. Senior cashed the ♠A, his partner's suit, and Bird followed with the discouraging deuce. So Senior switched to the ♦10, won by Bird's ace, but that was the end of the defense – 5♥ bid and made.

Senior has two points to make about all this.

First he strongly criticized himself. "I should have given my lead at trick two a little more thought," he said. "Partner obviously wanted me to switch, but clubs looked wrong – look at those clubs in dummy. So diamonds looks right. But not the 10! I should have played the ♦K to see what partner played. He would have followed with the deuce. Then of course I would have led a club because he denied both spades and diamonds. He would have ruffed and we would have beaten the contract."

His second point concerns his partner's bidding. "I think partner should have doubled 5♥. That certainly would have got me thinking – my partner opened with a weak two-bid and now he's doubling. He had already shown two suits, so he probably was 6-5 in spades and diamonds. If he had two singletons he wouldn't double, so there would have to be only one possible answer – he had two trumps and no clubs. Now as long as I was awake I would find the club lead and 5♥ goes down."

### New Educational Fdn. President: Geoffrey Cross

### 'I was right, Ralph'

Deep Finesse is an excellent time-saving device for the would-be analyst. At the table my partner, Ralph Cohen (even though most charitable) surely raised an eyebrow when I passed his 3♥ overcall of West's 1NT opener. I apologized after he made four on a diamond lead. But I'm getting ahead of my story. This was the deal from second final from the three North American championships Saturday.

After winning the ♦A and frowning about having to play the king on it, Cohen advanced the ♥J in an attempt to set up an entry to dummy, but West ducked. But then Cohen led a spade to the king and ace, and West was toast. No matter what he led he had to give away a trick and let Cohen take 10 tricks.

But on review I saw according to Deep Finesse that nine tricks was the limit for us in hearts. On an opening spade lead, West has to return a diamond and then duck the ♥J. Now declarer can do no better than to try the ♣K. West wins the ace, cashes another club and gets out with a diamond. Later he collects the fourth defensive trick with the trump king.

There you are, Ralph – I was right all along!

### Find the orange box

If you're into golf, put your name in the orange, polka-dotted box at Registration. There will be two drawings from the box. On Monday, the winning name will receive two golf sessions on the Marriott course. On Wednesday, the winner will receive four sessions.

### Pretty play

Deep Finesse says that the maximum number of tricks that can be made in notrump on this deal is 10, but declarer on this deal made five. Was Deep Finesse wrong, or could the defense have done better?

Harry Pollitt of Beaufort NC, who brought us this deal, led the ♣J to partner's ace, and North returned a spade to the ace. Declarer won two rounds of hearts, the ♣K and ♣Q and four diamonds, ending in his hand. This was the position as declarer prepared to take his last diamond (the North and West cards are immaterial):

"There was nothing I could do when declarer cashed that diamond," said Pollitt. If I discarded a spade, declarer's spades were good. "If I ditched a club, he could throw me in with my last club and I'd have to lead into his spade tenace. Either way he had 11 tricks. And if pard ducks the first club, declarer can play another round of clubs and reach the same position. Does any opening lead break up this squeeze?"

Yes, says Deep Finesse – a spade. North's jack goes to the ace and declarer has to set up club tricks. He crosses to a diamond and leads a club. North probably ducks, but declarer goes back with another diamond and leads another club. North wins and leads a second spade, setting up South's queen and breaking up the squeeze.

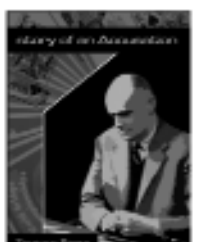

Hinckley decided to rebid 1NT instead of 2♦, and North thought it was time to balance. Hinckley didn't double – she didn't want the opponents to run to clubs where they can make nine tricks if played by South.

Everything worked out the way she hoped. She led the ♥Q, ducked, and continued with the ♥2 to Schuld's ace. Schuld switched to a club to partner's ace, and Hinckley gave her a heart ruff. Schuld then took the ♣K and gave partner a club ruff. Hinckley still had to get another trump trick, good for the magic 200 number.

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS



## Calling the Director

Martha McGhee, co-chair of the 1998 Orlando NABC, was IN chairman at the 1992 Orlando NABC.

Call the who ...? The director! It's okay to call the director. In fact, if you don't, you may lose your right to call him later if you are damaged.

The director is the one who sold you an entry, the one who passed out the board, the one who passed out the hand records and said, "Duplicate, please." The director is the one who organized the players and the boards so that everything runs smoothly at the right time, the right speed and the right direction.

The director is the one you need help from if and when an irregularity happens at your table. The director gives rulings pertaining to the *Laws of Duplicate Contract Bridge*.

In order for the conditions of the game to be fair, everyone has to follow the same rules. The director is familiar with these rules and is responsible for seeing that they are correctly applied.

The director is also the one who calls the rounds when it is time for you to meet your new opponents. The director puts the results of each board into the computer and posts the computer print-out of results after each session.

When you need a director, raise your hand and call out "Director, please" — loudly enough for him to hear but not so loudly that it disturbs the other players. When the director arrives at your table, he will listen to what happened and explain to the players the ruling that pertains to the irregularity.

Some rulings have several options, so if you don't understand them fully, don't hesitate to ask for them to be repeated.

Since the conditions at each table must be duplicated as much as possible, all the players must adhere to the same set of rules. The director's main objective is to make the game as fair as possible for all the players involved, while ensuring that everyone has an enjoyable time.

Irregularities that may happen at your table

for which you must call the director: a lead out of turn, an insufficient bid, a revoke, a card missing from a hand, a bid or pass out of turn, failure to Alert an artificial bid, changes of call, disagreements of tricks won, claims with trumps outstanding or disputed claims, bidding errors, etc.

The director is your friend. Do not hesitate to call him or her. In fact, if you don't call the director, you may lose the right to call him later when you discover you have been damaged.

## Thinking Bridge #4

You (West) lead the ♥2. East wins the first heart cheaply and cashes the ♥A K. Plan your defense.

East's 2♥ weak jump overcall is the equivalent of a weak two opening bid. In other words, it shows a presentable six-card suit (three honors or two honors with the 9 thrown in for good measure) and about 6-9 high-card points.

You make the obvious singleton lead (some people love singleton leads so much that they lead them even when they don't have them). Partner wins the first heart as cheaply as possible (playing the 7 if dummy plays low) and cashes the ♥K.

It is clear that you will be able to make two discards on the ♥K A. When contemplating discards, always consider discarding from your shortest suit — in this case, diamonds.

You can see that you can discard both the ♦K Q. Should you? Yes. Why not? If you discard both diamonds, you can ruff the diamond return and defeat the contract.

If you keep your diamonds and discard clubs, you may or may not take a trick in diamonds. (As it happens, you won't because declarer has a singleton.)

Point to remember: When partner is cashing a number of tricks, allowing you to make a discard or two, consider discarding from your short suit. If you can void yourself in a suit while partner still has the lead, you can then ruff partner's return in your now-void suit. Not a bad idea.

Sacramento. He settled in his current home town after going there to college – Cal State-Sacramento, where he earned bachelor's and master's degrees in communications studies.

Smith encountered bridge in the late Sixties. Married at the time – he is a bachelor now – Smith says it seemed that a lot of his friends played the game.

His introduction to bridge was through Sylvia Clark, who was offering bridge lessons at a local department store. After Smith and his wife completed the lessons, Clark pointed them to the local duplicate club.

Smith was immediately hooked, and he joined the ACBL in 1972.

After working for the state of California for 10 years as a personnel analyst, Smith went into real estate. Today, he is a real estate broker and part-time teacher at his alma mater.

Smith has always enjoyed playing bridge, but he had a strong attraction to the administrative side of the game. Only two years after joining the ACBL, he was elected to the board of directors of Unit 505 in Sacramento.

With that election, he recalls, he was appointed to the District 21 board because of what he could offer that group as a new player.

Smith says he plans to take the grand tour of the ACBL districts and probably will play in one or two regionals a month as he spreads the word about the good that's happening in the ACBL.

Smith acknowledges that there are areas where work is needed, but he believes it's better to spread a message of goodwill to the membership.

When he isn't playing bridge or working, Smith spends time rooting for the Sacramento Kings of the National Basketball Association. "I'm a season ticket holder," he says.

## ZT — are we doing better?

The ACBL Board of Directors — citing a commitment to "improving acceptable player behavior at all times" — adopted Zero Tolerance as ACBL policy in 1998.

Unacceptable behavior has decreased – the goal, however, is to eliminate unacceptable behavior as much as possible.

Please report conduct that is unacceptable while keeping in mind that we must be tolerant of other people in general — and bridge players in particular. Also report conduct that is outstanding or refreshing.

Commendable behavior includes (but is not limited to):

- Being a good "host" or "guest" at the table.
- Greeting others in a friendly manner.
- Praising the bidding and/or play of the opponents.

• Having two clearly completed convention cards readily available to the opponents. This is also a regulation.

Unacceptable behavior includes (but is not limited to):

- Badgering, rudeness, insinuations, intimidation, profanity, threats or violence.
- Negative comments concerning opponents' or partner's play or bidding.
- Gloating over good results.
- Constant and gratuitous lessons and analyses at the table.
- Loud and disruptive arguing with a director's ruling.

If you experience someone exhibiting discourteous behavior or being other than civil, please call a tournament director immediately. If you feel that there was a very serious breach of discipline, in addition to the resolution by the tournament director at the table, please discuss the problem directly with the Director-in-Charge.

The director will then attempt to determine the facts. If he establishes there was unacceptable behavior, an immediate 1/4-board disciplinary penalty (3 IMPs in team games) shall be assigned to all offenders.

This may involve any one or all four players at the table, regardless of who initiated the unacceptable behavior. If both members of a partnership are guilty, the penalties are cumulative (1/4 board each = 1/2 board or 3 IMPs each = 6 IMPs).

If it is determined that a second offense has occurred in the same event, the offender(s) shall be ejected from future competition in that event.

An offender removed from an event shall be deemed not to have played in the event, no masterpoints will be awarded and no refunds will be made.

Regardless of who may have initiated unacceptable behavior, all offenses are punishable. Retaliatory behavior is a punishable offense. Frivolous accusations will also be considered as offenses under this policy.

When Richard Pavlicek and his son, Richard Jr., won the Bobby Nail Life Master Open Pairs this weekend, it reminded me of my favorite partner when I was a teenager: my dad. He was the first Life Master of Jersey City NJ, where I grew up. Once my dad made a play after reading about it in a Marshall Miles book (*All 52 Cards*), but more about this later. Look at what happened at the Pavliceks' table on this deal.

When the elder Pavlicek was North, he declared 3NT. East led the ♦6 and West put in the 10, trying to falsecard declarer. Pavlicek won, led a club to the ace

and called for a diamond. West played the 7, and Pavlicek finessed, putting in the 8. He was now up to 8 tricks and led the ♦K to West's ace, establishing his ninth trick. Crunch time. If West shifts to a low spade, the defenders take four spade tricks to defeat the contract. But a low spade shift would be a losing play if North held the king or jack, so West exited safely with a diamond. Declarer now had nine tricks.

Could East have helped West by signaling suit-preference while following suit? He could. After leading the ♦6, he should follow with the 5 and then the 4, high-low, asking for a spade shift. He should also play the ♣7, his highest club when following in clubs, trying to scream for a spade shift.

Now let's go to Marshall Miles' table, where he declared 3NT from the South position on the auction shown in the preview at the beginning of this article.

Here, West led the ♥J and Miles won with the queen as East followed with the 2. Miles led a diamond to the king, returned to hand with the ♣A and led another diamond. West went up with the ace and considered shifting to spades, but decided that Miles probably held the king, since he had bid 3NT with nothing in diamonds and needed something for his bid. So West continued hearts and Miles made 10 tricks! Again, East could have helped West to find the spade shift by signaling suit-preference when following suit to declarer's lead (instead of giving count). East must play the ♦6 and ♦5, indicating the ♠K.

Answer to the preview problem: Win the first trick with the ♥A! This is the play my dad had made many years ago. When you lead diamonds, West will probably win and continue with a low heart to his partner's "queen." OOPS! I don't blame Miles for missing this play — it's been 50 years since he wrote about it in his book.

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6 board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.
