## You can watch Reisinger at home

Just imagine – you don't even have to be here to watch the key match in the Reisinger Board-a-Match or the Senior Knockouts. Just turn on your computer at home (or your room), go to Bridge Base Online, and settle back and watch.

Like just about anything else in the computer world, the present fine-tuned system came about little by little. Back in the old days, there were wires everywhere when a match was vugraphed. A special phone line had to be set up, and all kinds of electrical equipment were necessary. Someone had to sit at table-side and call in every bid and every play to someone in the vugraph theater. Only one table could be covered. The result at the Closed

As expected, attendance took a major drop yesterday because of Thanksgiving Day. The total now is 11,982 tables. Unless attendance rebounds this weekend (unlikely), we are not likely to reach 15,000 tables for the tournament.

## Bennett vs. Ames in Senior KO final

The teams captained by Hamish Bennett of Menlo Park CA and Tony Ames of Minnetonka MN survived extremely tight semifinal matches to qualify for today's final in the Senior Knockout Teams.

The Ames squad is the surprise of the event – they started out as the #23 seed. Ames looked solid at the half, up by 27, but Rosenkranz completely wiped that out to go into the final 16 boards in a dead tie. Ames pulled ahead again in the final quarter, leading going into the last two boards by 17. But a major swing on a notrump deal cost Ames 14 IMPs. The last board was a part-score deal, and Rosenkranz was able to gain only a single IMP, so Ames took the match by 2 IMPs, 152-150.

Playing with Ames are John Koch of St. Cloud MN and Rod Beery and Mary Egan NE. George Rosenkranz's teammates were Miguel Reygadas, Roger Bates, Bruce Ferguson, Neil Chambers and John Schermer.

The team captained by Mel Colchamiro of Merrick NY staged a colossal comeback over the

## Sadek, Elahmady capture Blue Ribbon

Egyptian friends and business partners Tarek Sadek and Walid El Admady fought off a hard charge by Robert Levin and Steve Weinstein to win the Blue Ribbon Pairs by about a quarter of a board.

Sadek and Elahmady, who live in Cairo, posted a 61.61% game, just enough to finish ahead of Levin and Weinstein, who had a huge game at 69.46%. Drew Casen and Jim Kjekorian were third. Top on a board was 51.

The Egyptians, who have finished second in the Cavendish Invitational Pairs two times – once to Levin and Weinstein – won their first North American championship together. Elahmady and Zia Mahmood won the six-session Von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs last summer in New York.

Sadek and Elahmady own a software company together and have been partners for 20 years.

With a session to go, the winners were in second place.

The fact that they are bridge partners and business partners does not cause friction, said Sadek: "We are friends."

## Istanbul adventures great for 'den mother'

If it's true that the best way to learn is by doing, Donna Compton got a great big chunk of education recently in Istanbul, Turkey.

It was in that exotic city that Compton took her first turn as non-playing captain of a bridge team – in this case the American entry in the World University Team Championships.

"It was a lot more difficult than I expected," says Compton, who has had a reunion of sorts with several members of the team during the Fall NABC in Orlando.

Mike Shuman, West, broke the rule – the only way to set the contract at the point where he ruffed. Alan Truscott, the declarer, came by to tell us about it.

Shuman led a heart to Truscott's ace, and Truscott crossed to dummy with a trump to cash the two hearts and discard two diamonds from his hand. Then he got out with a diamond to East's queen. East continued with the ♦K, ruffed by declarer. Truscott went after clubs, his jack losing to the queen. East attempted to cash his ♣A, but Shuman was having no part of this. He ruffed and led a trump.

That left Truscott with one too few trumps to ruff out all his losers and he went one in the soup. If Shuman had allowed the ♣A to win, Truscott could have crossruffed to victory.

### Bronze Life Master

### Good – not good enough

Barry Rigal played his first ever session with Marty Fleisher in the one-day Swiss on Wednesday. They got to play five matches and averaged 27 Victory Points on a 30 possible. But all that made no impression on the runaway leaders – the Baldersen team – who finished with an impressive 202 VPs out of a possible 240.

Fleisher and Rigal offered this deal where they had a chance to do better.

North

You bid 1♦ as South, get a 1♠ response and your 1NT rebid ends the auction. Bad news – they lead a club and the queen does not hold the trick. The good news is that the clubs are temporarily blocked. You only have to find two discards from both hand and dummy for the time being. What will your discards be?

At the table declarer pitched a spade and a heart from hand and a spade and a diamond from dummy – the latter being the fatal mistake. This was the full deal:

At trick five West found a nice play – he underled his ♠A. Then when declarer finessed in diamonds, West won, cashed his ♠A and got out with the ♦10, locking declarer in his hand. Although declarer could have succeeded in a number of ways, the easiest is to keep all four diamonds in dummy so he will have a re-entry to North for the good spade.

### Tough game

Bernie Chazen is nothing if not a good sport. He dropped by the Daily Bulletin office to tell a story on his own quintet from Wednesday's StratiFlighted Swiss Teams.

Total masterpoints for the team — Chazen, Allan Cokin, Jim Sternberg, Russ Arnold and Paul Swanson – amount to nearly 66,000. Each player has at least two North American championships to his credit.

Not that any of that impressed the field in the Flight A/X segment of the event. Despite their credentials, the powerhouse squad won no matches in the first half of the event, withdrawing to salve their bruised egos over dinner.

Furthermore, said Chazen, he ran into Benito Garozzo, owner of 13 world championships, and found that the former Italian star was in the same boat – no wins in four tries.

"This must be the toughest field in history," said Chazen with a chuckle.

# Thankful for the IMPs

The team captained by Tony Ames has been pulling surprises since the Senior Knockout Teams began, and they continued the trend on Thanksgiving Day with a 152-150 victory over the veteran George Rosenkranz squad. Ames, of Minnetonka MN, is playing with John Koch, St. Cloud MN, and two Lincoln NE players – Rod Beery and Mary Egan. Rosenkranz's teammates were Miguel Reygadas of Mexico; Roger Bates, Mesa AZ; Bruce Ferguson, Boise ID; Neil Chambers, Schenectady NY and John Schermer, Seattle WA..

The Ames team jumped out to an early lead against Rosenkranz, thanks to this deal, the third of the match.

Ferguson's 4♠ was due to go down two if South led his singleton diamond and got a ruff, but Beery simply bid on in hearts. Ferguson won the ♦K lead with the ace and played a low heart to the queen and ace, then returned the ♥J to the king, followed by a low spade. East won the top two spades and exited with a diamond, ruffed by Ferguson. He played a low club to dummy, claiming at that point – he could ruff dummy's third spade, then run trumps. When Ferguson played his last trump, West would have to find a discard from the ♦Q and two clubs. He would pitch a club, of course, and Ferguson would toss dummy's ♦J. When Ferguson played a club from hand, if West didn't follow with the queen, Ferguson would know the card was singleton in the other hand.

With correct defense, 4♠ doubled was going to produce a plus of 500 for North-South. Schermer thought about his bid for a long time before pulling to 5♦, which produced the same number of tricks that 4♠ would have, except it was one level higher. Minus 800 was an 8-IMP loss for the Rosenkranz team.

The other big swing of the set occurred on board 10.

The auctions were similar and the defense took virtually the same path – up to a point.

In the open room, Beery led the ♠J, which ran to the king in declarer's hand. Bates played a low diamond at trick two, and Beery hopped up with the ace. He played the ♠A, partner unblocking the ♠Q, then cashed two more spades. When Beery exited with the ♥10, Bates had to make a decision. If he rose with the ♥A, he would need the lie of the cards that actually existed: East with a doubleton ♦A Q. Eventually, Bates settled on the heart finesse, and when it failed he was down one.

At the other table, the play and defense went exactly the same, except that when Chambers finished cashing spades, he got out with the ♦Q, so Ames had his ninth trick without having to consider the heart finesse. Plus 600 was good for 12 IMPs to the Ames team, which ended the first quarter with a 30-18 lead.

Rosenkranz struck back for 13 IMPs early in the second quarter when Rosenkranz and Reygadas blew their opponents out of the water with a preemptive action.

Reygadas and Rosenkranz play a strong club system part of the time, so Reygadas' 1♦ didn't guarantee more than two. Ames' pass with the North hand was very conservative and, even worse, North-South didn't even go plus with 26 high-card points.

Koch led a low heart, and Reygadas discarded dummy's two clubs right away. He then played the ♠Q from hand. Ames won and played the ♦A and a diamond to Reygadas' king, but there were only two more tricks coming for the defenders – the ♦Q and a high spade. Plus 110 to Reygadas.

Beery started with the ♥10 – not a success. Bates won the queen and immediately fired back a heart. Beery won and switched to a low club, but the 10 held in dummy, and Bates played a spade to hand and continued with a heart. The defenders got only two tricks. Plus 660 was good for 13 IMPs to Rosenkranz.

They lost it all back – and then some – two boards later.

In the closed room, Ames and Koch bid to 7♠ on the North-South cards after North started with a strong 1♣ and South made a positive response in clubs.

Reygadas, on lead without a lot of information from the bidding, started with a low heart, all Ames needed to make the grand slam. He won the ♥10 in hand, cashed the ♥A, ruffed a heart in dummy, then re-entered his hand with a diamond. The fourth heart was ruffed with dummy's ♠Q, and when Ames returned to hand with a diamond and played trumps, he was able to claim for plus 2210.

In the other room, Beery had a bit more information to help him with his opening lead.

Beery started with the ♠4, which Bates won in dummy with the ace. As you can see, with clubs splitting 3-3 and trumps going 3-2, declarer can take 13 tricks. Bates was not in seven, however, so his target was 12 tricks, and a 50% heart finesse, with additional extra chances for the ♥J to fall, was a better plan.

At trick two, Bates played a heart to the queen. Beery won the ♥K and played another trump. Bates won the ♠9 in hand, cashed the ♥A and ruffed a heart. When the jack didn't fall, Bates had to rely on the club finesse, which failed. Minus 100 was a 20-IMP loss for the Rosenkranz team.

Two boards later, the Ames team came up with another significant gain.

Rosenkranz and Reygadas do not play a strong 1♣ when they are vulnerable, so their auction on this occasion was natural. Koch had no difficulty with his heart opening lead, and North-South took the first six tricks for plus 200. It might have been a loss of only 3 IMPs, except for what happened at the other table.

Sincoff led a low spade, taken in dummy with the king, and Berkowitz, playing nearly double dummy because of the bidding, called for the ♥J, which held. A second heart went to the queen, and Berkowitz played a low diamond from hand. Sincoff rose with the ace and played a second spade, which Berkowitz won in hand with the ace.

He played a diamond to the jack, then played a third heart went to his 9, and when Berkowitz cashed the ♥A, pitching a club from dummy, he showed West his fifth heart, then the ♣A, saying to her, "When I play the ace of clubs, you will be in big trouble."

This was the ending:

Berkowitz already had eight tricks – two spades, four hearts and two diamonds – with the ♣A, ♠Q and ♦K as sure winners. On the fifth spade, West could discard the ♣K as declarer pitched the ♣Q from dummy, but when Berkowitz played the ♣A, Sincoff could not find a good discard. Plus 480 was worth 20.5 out of 25 matchpoints for Berkowitz and Larry Cohen.

## Matchmaker, Matchmaker

Otto Walter of Cincinnati worked the Partnership Desk at the 2000 Spring NABC and reports that he heard several variations on the following ditty:

Matchmaker, matchmaker, make me a match,  
 find me a player who can earn a high scratch,  
 so when the day's event is all done,  
 on the recap I'll be number one.

For pairs games, Rodwell would be good,  
 for Swiss, make it Paul Soloway,  
 for KOs, well, I know that I should

The opening spade lead rode to her 10, and she crossed to the ♦Q to try a finesse to the ♥Q. This failed, and West shot back the ♠Q to the king. Stober cashed a heart and was happy to see that the trump suit broke 2-2.

Then she set up a Vienna Coup – she cashed the ♣A to make dummy's queen a threat card. After winning the ♠A and the ♦K she ran trumps. West had started with four diamonds as well as the ♣K so he was squeezed — he couldn't keep the ♣K and two diamonds in the two-card end position.

Keith Garber, Stober's partner, drew an interesting conclusion on this deal from a different bracketed knockout event.

Garber made a surprise opening lead – the ♥A. He continued with a second heart to the 10, jack and king. Declarer led a club and ducked when Garber produced the queen. That started Garber thinking. Clearly declarer had only two clubs. But why didn't he try to run the clubs? If he thought hearts were going to run, that's no doubt what he would have done. But he didn't, so he must still have a heart stopper.

So Garber decided to forget about hearts. He wanted two spade tricks, but he had to get his partner on lead for that. So he led a diamond, and sure enough his partner had the ace. She returned a spade, and the contract was down one.

## Slow Play

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous to your opponents – and to all other competitors as well. Players and pairs who take more than their allotted time are subject to penalty.

In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and/or pay no attention to time limits will be penalized.

West leads the ♥4. You (East) have five cashing club tricks if you can gain the lead (not likely) or if partner gains the lead and shifts to a club. Do you have a plan?

You were all set to make a lead-directing double of a 3♣ Stayman bid but you never got the chance. Worse, partner has led your void suit (what else is new?) and you have to make a discard.

Furthermore, if declarer correctly wins the opening lead in dummy and plays a second heart to the queen (setting up the tricks he needs for his contract: three hearts, three spades and two diamonds), you have to make another discard.

When you have a suit you are dying for partner to lead, you have two options:

(1) You can discard an encouraging card in the suit you want led.

(2) You can discard a discouraging card in the suit(s) you don't want led.

Which is better? Well, if you are into discarding the setting trick(s), go for #1. If you are interested

## Diversity rules in the I/N games

Conventional wisdom tells us that Intermediate/Newcomer players don't travel: if local players don't support the I/N games, they will be very small.

Maybe so in some venues, but not in Orlando.

Even on Thanksgiving Eve, 23 states, several Canadian provinces and Israel were represented. In the 12-table Swiss on Wednesday evening, players came from eight states, including Alaska, as well as Canada.

Over the first week of the tournament, 750 players representing all 50 states won nearly 2000 masterpoints, just in the I/N area. This doesn't count all the 0-300 players involved in KOs or the open events.



in defeating contracts, however, #2 is the way to go.

Take this deal. If you discard an encouraging club, partner will win the ♥K and switch to a club — that's the good news. The bad news is that now you can take only four club tricks instead of five. Declarer wins up making 2NT.

On the other hand, if you discard a discouraging spade at trick one and a discouraging diamond at trick two, there is a chance that a reasonable partner will find a club shift at trick three. If he does, you can cash five, not four, club tricks and defeat the contract one trick.

It's been said before, but it can't hurt to hear it again: Discard losers, keep winners.

Point to remember: When discarding, particularly at notrump, tend to keep cards in the suit you want partner to lead. Discard discouraging cards in suits you do not want partner to lead. Amen.

## Rules for being a good partner

By Marty Bergen

Before you sit down to discuss what you are playing, you should start your partnership off on the right note. Half the battle of winning is being a good partner. Always observe the following:

1. Do not give lessons — unless you are being paid to do so.

2. Never say anything to your partner unless you would want him to say the same to you. If you are unsure whether your partner would want you to say something, don't.

3. Never "result" (criticize your partner for a normal action just because it did not work this time).

4. Unless your intent is to clear up a misunderstanding, avoid discussing the hand just played. If you cannot resist, be discreet.

5. Remember that you and your partner are on the same side.

6. Do not forget that your partner wants to win just as much as you do.

7. If you feel the urge to be nasty, sarcastic, critical or loud — excuse yourself and take a walk.

8. When there is time between hands, do not discuss bridge.

9. When you want to consult another player about a disaster, ask about your hand, not your partner's.

10. Do not ever criticize or embarrass your partner in front of others.

uncertain about the meaning of the 5♥ bid.

North-South contended that the break in tempo should constrain East-West from bidding at the seven level. North-South also pointed out that 6♠ could be held to six with a diamond lead.

**The Decision:** The committee determined that the break in tempo suggested that West's 5♠ response might not be accurate and, therefore, made bidding a grand slam more attractive. The committee found that without the break in tempo there were logical alternatives to bidding a grand slam. Applying Law 12C2, the Committee determined that the most unfavorable result at all probable for E-W was 6NT not 6S. The committee considered that the same rationale used by East to opt for 7NT instead of 7♠ would also lead East to choose notrump at the six level, if a grand slam were not to be bid. Therefore the best result likely for North-South was 6NT by East-West. Also, the worst result at all probable for East-West was 6NT. The contract easily makes all the tricks for reciprocal 1460s.

Since the committee's decision gave E-W a better score than the director had done, the committee did not seriously consider whether the appeal was without merit.

**Director's Ruling:** The director ruled that unauthorized information existed from the hesitation and that it suggested that West was confused and might have the ♠Q, which was systemically denied by the 5♠ bid. Applying Law 16A, the director adjusted the score to 6♠ making seven, East-West plus 1460, per Law 12C2.

**The Appeal:** The East-West pair acknowledged that there was a significant break in tempo over the 5♥ queen ask. The pair also said that the positive 2♠ response could be made on as little as the six spades to the king and an outside queen. East acknowledged that she thought her partner could be

reason for not bidding notrump despite holding the ♥K, which declarer was surprised to see winning the first trick. From there, Egan had to lose three more tricks, but she finished at plus 130 for an 8-IMP gain.

Rosenkranz fought back, scoring a double-digit swing when Egan and Beery landed in an awkward contract of 4NT despite an eight-card spade fit, going two down while Rosenkranz and Reygadas were in a sensible 4♠, taking 11 tricks for plus 450.

On this following deal, the key element was who was on opening lead, and Ames benefited from the difference.

Reygadas' heart lead is perfectly normal, but it wasn't as effective as a club lead. Ames put in the ♥10, winning the jack and with the ace. He cashed a high diamond, played a spade to the king and continued with a diamond to his 10. With the queen onside and the suit splitting, Ames was able to re-enter dummy in diamonds and take a spade finesse. It lost, but declarer still had two aces in dummy to win the next trick and play a spade to hand. When that suit split 3-3, Ames could use the other ace to get back to dummy to cash the 13<sup>th</sup> spade for plus 430.

That solved the suit for Ferguson, but on the run of the diamonds he pitched a spade from his hand, and when the spade finesse failed he did not have enough winners. Room table had to be carried to the vugraph room by a caddy. The hands had to be written with grease pencils and placed on an overhead projector. It took a lot of planning, and lots of things could go wrong.

Later we learned to use a house phone for results, getting rid of most of the phone wires. Then we began to use computers to put the hands on the screen. It was possible to follow the bidding and play by way of the computers.

During all this time Fred Gitelman, the 2005 Honorary Member of the Year, was hard at work on Bridge Base. About three years ago, Bridge Base gained the ability to connect to the Internet from table-side. An operator could quietly input every call and play as they were made. The possibility for error was almost eradicated.

The Internet presentation covers both tables of a match live.

Having someone with a computer at the table doesn't bother the players - in fact, they like it. It's quiet - no one is announcing bids and plays.

The bridge world liked the Internet presentation. The word spread around the world, and thousands of fans began to turn on their computers to follow the big matches. For example, yesterday there was no prior announcement about the fact that the Senior Knockouts were going to be shown. But some folks discovered it, and they e-mailed their friends. The match started at 10 a.m., and by 10:45 a.m. there were 300 kibitzers for one room and about 250 for the other. During the International Team Trials in Memphis last spring, as many as 5000 fans were tuned in at any given time.

The Reisinger should draw a large crowd - it has been publicized in advance.

Rick Beye, who is in charge of the program, got his start in vugraph in 1987. When Gitelman first put his program into use, Beye worked with Karen Cooper and Doug Grove. "Somehow it became my project in 1992, and I've been trying to pass it on to someone else ever since," joked Beye.

Beye recalls his worst moment. "We switched tables during the Spingold in New York last summer - the Nickell-Jacobs match looked as if it was over. So we missed that great comeback by the Nickell team in the last quarter."

The ACBL has about a dozen tournament directors who can handle the computer task at the table. At this tournament, Kevin Perkins of Austin, Diane Beyer of Chicago and Jeanne Molnar of San Diego are doing the job.

"Working a table is like using your computer," said Perkins. "You just turn it on, look for Bridge Base and go to work."

"We have to work around certain situations, like when a lead out of turn or an insufficient bid is accepted. I think Fred (Gitelman) is working on solving these small problems. It really doesn't affect the Internet presentation very much."

"We also let the spectators know about Alerts, hesitations and remarks. It's a good show for the viewers."

Joon Pahk and John Kranyak, who didn't make it to the NABC.

Compton's husband, Chris, president of the United States Bridge Federation, was coach of the team in Turkey.

Donna says she is proud of the squad for coming home with a bronze medal in the competition, behind Poland and Belgium. It wasn't easy.

First of all, she says, the team was thrown together only five weeks before the competition began in November. Ten days before the tournament started, the team had only five members.

Three of the players were on the East Coast, three on the West Coast, and there was only one partnership with any playing experience to speak of. While Compton frantically tried to arrange practice sessions for the new partnerships, she also managed to arranged some financial backing for the team. That came from the organizers of the Cavendish.

Prior to Istanbul, Compton thought being an npc was pretty much just turning in lineups and making sure that four players were seated at game time, then recording the matches.

She found that her job entailed way more than that. Before it was through, the self-styled "den mother" understood how important nurturing can be to such a group.

For starters, she had a vegetarian on the team, so she had to arrange special meals, and shortly after the team had settled into their hotel rooms, one of the young players broke the news that he had lost his airline ticket home. "My first official duty," Compton recalls, "was getting the ticket replaced."

Another team member had arrived in Istanbul

without the proper clothing for the opening ceremonies. It was off to the Grand Bazaar, an adventure in itself. Compton managed to negotiate the purchase of a suit, shirt, tie, shoes and socks – all for \$60. "Then I had to get it tailored," she said. "It was very nice." Another member of the team ended up buying the same outfit.

The team started out with lodging in the dormitory at the University of Istanbul, but it was 45 minutes away from the playing site and traffic can be horrendous in the city. Compton eventually had to figure out a way to get the young players moved to the Grand Cevahir Hotel and Convention Center.

Then there was the matter of Compton's decisions as npc. "There were some 'discussions,'" she says. "I had to deal with a little bit of dissension, but they respected my reasons."

Compton says she wouldn't trade the experience for anything. "Getting to know them was a fun part of the job," she says, "and I had a great time."

In the end, she says, she and the team bonded because of the experience. She says she would take a similar job any time and she has nothing but praise for the young players.

"We were the best dressed and best behaved team at the tournament," she says.
