## Florida couple win National 99er Pairs

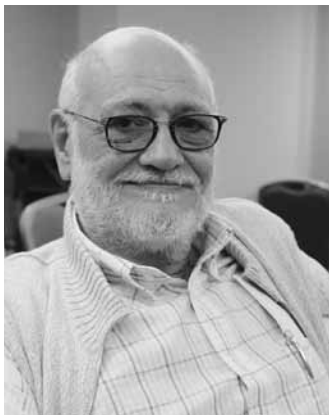
Pat and Chuck Grams of Dunnellon FL scored two 60%-plus games to win the two-session National 99ers Pairs. Their total score was 61.17%, comfortably ahead of two pairs who tied for second with 57.67%.

The winners play mostly in home games and have about 10 masterpoints each. They say their mentors are Jim and Gwen Baker, also of Dunnellon FL, who won the National 199er Pairs in New Orleans. Before playing here, the Bakers told them, "Wouldn't it be great if you won, too!"

Pat Grams is a retired school teacher and husband Chuck is a retired accountant.

Two pairs tied for second place: Kathleen Smith and Suzanne Batt, both of Sun City Center FL, and Will and Ann Sutherland of North York ON.

## Well-traveled WBF chief manages varied agenda



Some time in the near future, perhaps less than a year from now, there will be a revolutionary change in the way bridge is viewed online. Perhaps as soon as the World Bridge Championships in the Netherlands next year, cameras will

record every bid and play at numerous tables – and spectators will be able to view whoever they want to, even in a large field, and switch easily from table to table.

This is part of the message that new World Bridge Federation President Gianarrigo Rona is spreading on a worldwide trip to get to know other bridge administrators. He is in Orlando this week to meet with members of Zone 2 (North America).

"I want to share ideas and plans," says Rona. "We have to define a common way of working and teaching bridge."

## Massachusetts pair leads Mini-Blues

Dean Panagopoulos of Lynn MA and Yiji Starr of Wayland MA lead the way into today's final of the 0—5000 Blue Ribbon Pairs. Sixty-four pairs, out of the original field of 256, will play two sessions today to determine the winner.

The leader's carryover of 67.93 gives them a 6.85 matchpoint margin ahead of Franklin Kastle of Flint MI and P. Drew Cannell of Doll-Des-Ormeau QC who have a carryover of 61.08. The leaders after the first day of play, Doug Levene and Mark Jones, both of Birmingham AL, are in third place with a carryover of 51.88 matchpoints.

The six-session event, formerly a four-session event, is open to players who have fewer than 5000 masterpoints and have earned a Blue Ribbon qualification.

## Rosenberg, Zeckhauser Leading Blue Ribbon

With two final sessions to play in the Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs, Michael Rosenberg and Richard Zeckhauser lead a field that is tightly bunched at the top. Their carryover of 85.83 matchpoints puts them slightly more than one-third of a board ahead of the second-place pair, Jan Jansma and Jay Borker.

In third, only a quarter-board out of second, are Sabine Auken and Daniela von Arnim, with David Berkowitz and Alan Sontag just a fraction back in fourth place.

### Bruce Keidan 1943 – 2010

Bruce Keidan, veteran player and a former sports editor, died of complications from diabetes Tuesday night in Orlando. The Lakewood Ranch FL resident was 67.

The Philadelphia native had a long career in the newspaper business, working as a sports writer and columnist for the Seattle Times and the Philadelphia Inquirer. From 1978 to 2003, he was sports editor of the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette.

He managed media relations and publicity for the World Bridge Federation at the bridge exhibition in Salt Lake City just prior to the start of the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in that city, and later that year did the same job for the WBF at the World Bridge Series Championships in Montreal. He also helped with media relations during the recently concluded world championships in Philadelphia.

Keidan gained fame in the bridge world in 1975 during the Bermuda Bowl final between the USA and Italy. While observing one session, Keidan noticed two Italian players making contact with their feet underneath the bridge table. After he brought it to the attention of the American team, the ensuing scandal nearly resulted in the withdrawal of Team USA, who went on to lose to the Italians.

Keidan was a Diamond Life Master with 6285 masterpoints.

He is survived by his wife, Gene; a son, Gregory Keidan of San Francisco; three stepdaughters and six grandchildren.

### Parking shuttle notice

The parking shuttle takes people from the parking area to the hotel lobby. Bridge players can ask the shuttle driver do drop them off at the convention center instead to avoid the long walk.

### Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

### Food discount

Bridge players get a 20% discount at the food court if they mention they are bridge players.

### Jacobs tops 10,000 MPs

Hans Jacobs, veteran player and bridge administrator, came to Orlando needing 12.34 masterpoints to top the 10,000 mark. He and his team won the Sunday-Monday Knockout Teams, grabbing more than 44 masterpoints to advance to the rank of Platinum Life Master.

The native of Germany who emigrated to Canada in 1954 has taught bridge, run a bridge club, served on the ACBL Board of Governors, is a member of the national Goodwill Committee and is former president of District 2. He is also a co-founder of Zero Tolerance.

As a player, he has more than 100 Flight A regional wins and was the Richmond Trophy winner (most masterpoints by a Canadian in a calendar year) in 1997.

His favorite partner in bridge and in life is Debbie Bennett. They live in Downsview ON.

## Board-a-Match dilemmas

On this deal from the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, declarer and defender had a real problem. Assuming East is not a Kamikaze pilot, South will open a strong 1NT and declare 3NT.

On a low club lead, declarer will not duck for fear of a heart shift. Should he win in hand and take a diamond finesse to dislodge the entry from the danger hand? Or should he take the spade finesse to make it hard for West to shift to hearts if the finesse loses?

Note that if declarer takes the opening lead in dummy and runs the ♠J, the defenders can help one another. West ducks the first spade and East gives a Smith echo discouragement, then follows with the ♠8 – suit preference – for the heart shift at trick four.

Now West can win the ♠K and shift to the ♥K for all the marbles – well, nearly all of them. That would not have been enough against Eric Greco and Geoff Hampson. Greco doubled 3NT after 1NT – Pass – 2♣ – Pass; 2♠ – Pass – 2NT – Pass; 3NT and Hampson obediently led the ♥K. Declarer took an early diamond finesse and Greco cashed out. Now declarer got back in with a club, cashed his minor-suit winners and took the spade finesse. Hampson had blanked his ♠K, so he won that and cashed a club for plus 500.

## Caught in a Morton?

The final board we played in the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams qualifying did not give me grounds for optimism.

I was West, looking at ♥Q 10 4 in the slot and decided it was time to cash out. The ♦A did not paralyze declarer. That was an easy plus 480 for declarer.

Our teammate, Linda Gordon, received a low heart lead against a less revealing auction. Linda (playing with her husband, Robb), played low from dummy, ruffed, drew trumps in two rounds and led the ♦3 from hand. This is a classic Morton's Fork Coup. For those who don't remember the late Alan Truscott's dissertation on Henry VII's grasping cardinal, go back to the history books.

Anyway, if West ducks the ♦A, declarer can discard the ♦K on the ♥A and take 12 tricks thanks to the 3-3 split in clubs. If declarer takes the ♦A, declarer will have two discards (the ♦Q and ♥A) for her losing clubs. Note that an original club lead will hold declarer to 11 tricks so long as West takes the ♦A on the first lead and continues clubs.

Their teammates were Barbara Kalnitsky and Sandy Tamaccio, both of Boca Raton FL. Bernstein also achieved Bronze Life Master, a rank requiring 500 masterpoints.

Beverly Nuding of San Carlos CA is a new Life Master. She won the masterpoints she needed in the Southern Floriday Bridge Players Golf Tour Knockouts. She was playing with Betty Rosa of San Jose CA, Polly Siegel of Las Altos CA and Dan Harding of Mountain View CA.

## A matter of timing

Stan Tulin, West, played 3NT after opening 2NT with the West hand, just like the rest of the world, and got the ♠J lead, ducked to South's king. On the spade continuation, he won the queen, led the ♦8 to the queen and tried the ♣6 to the queen, which held, then ducked a spade. South won the heart and should have returned the suit to break up the ending.

When South fell from grace and returned a spade, Tulin won the ace, cashed the ♣A and diamond, ending in dummy, to squeeze North in the majors. Had South held both club honors, the position would have been reduced to a double squeeze with hearts as the pivot suit.

Larsen, North, started with the ♠Q, hitting his partner's suit. Declarer took the ♠A in dummy and played a low diamond to the king, followed by a low diamond from hand. Declarer ducked when Larsen played the ♦10, Meltzer pitching a low club.

Larsen continued with the ♠J, ducked by declarer. He then made the killing play – the ♥J!

Now the defenders had to score five tricks. Larsen could continue diamonds if the ♥J held the trick or take two hearts if declarer won and continued diamonds himself.

The heart switch is necessary, but on a low heart play, declarer covers with the 10 and can then set up a heart with impunity because South can't successfully attack spades and has no diamond.

Very well defended!

In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and/or pay no attention to time limits will be penalized.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

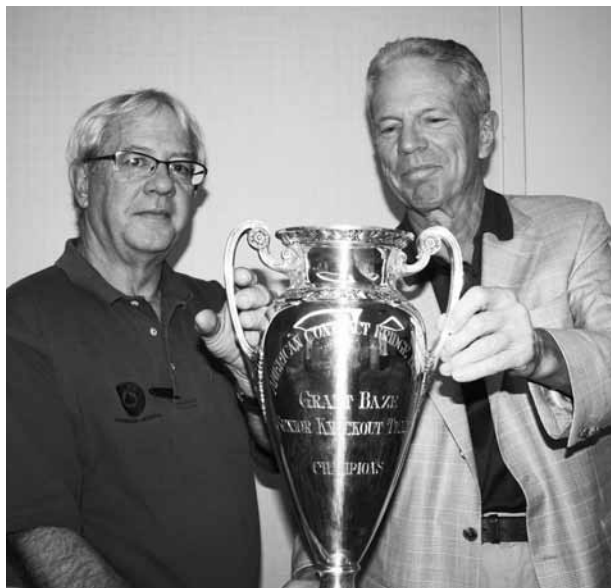
Jacobus, O'Rourke's regular partner on the team, said the squad kept her as non-playing captain despite her absence.

## A tribute to a friend

After friends of Grant Baze gathered to pay tribute to their late friend at the 2009 Spring NABC in Houston, several of them approached Michael Whitman with offers to extend the memorial.

After the ACBL Board of Directors voted to rename the Senior Knockout Teams to honor Baze, Whitman went searching for a suitable trophy. He found one in New York City, a sterling silver cup produced by Gorham Silversmiths of Providence RI in 1900. He had it engraved with Baze's name and the event named for him.

It was presented for the first time on Wednesday night to the Lou Ann O'Rourke squad after a short speech by Whitman. "We were friends for 40 years," said Whitman of Baze, one of the most highly regarded bridge professionals in ACBL annals. "I miss him."

Rona, of Italy, took over as WBF president at the end of the 13th World Bridge Series Championships in Philadelphia. He is former president of the European Bridge League and a longtime member of the executive committee of the WBF.

The innovative new way of watching bridge, he says, may debut at the 40th World Team Championships in Veldhoven, Netherlands (Oct. 15-29 next year).

The process for video capture of bidding and play, Rona says, is being studied now at the University of Amsterdam, and the Dutch Bridge Federation will test the process at a tournament in January. If the kinks can be worked out, the system will be used in Veldhoven. "The Dutch say we can use the system in the Bermuda Bowl," he says. "It is very exciting."

Another purpose of Rona's trip to Orlando is to invite North American players to go to Veldhoven to play in the World Transnational Open Teams, which has grown in popularity since it was first played in 1997. Players must qualify to play in events such as the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup, but the only requirement for playing in the WTOT is to be in good standing with your national bridge organization. In a transnational event, players from different countries may play together.

Veldhoven, the venue for the world championships, is a 90-minute drive from Amsterdam and is easily reachable by train.

In his meetings with ACBL board members in Orlando, Rona says he found a warm welcome and a spirit of cooperation. He plans to return to the U.S. for the 2011 Spring NABC in Louisville for more brainstorming sessions.

On his agenda for the future is a meeting of ACBL and WBF laws experts to examine existing bridge law with the goal of making the competitive bridge experience the same from country to country. "We can find a common way," he says.

The new WBF president has a lot on his plate at this point, including planning for and promotion of the second World Youth Congress in Croatia Aug. 22-31. Two American teams competed in the first such tournament, last year in Istanbul, Turkey.

A consensus builder, Rona says he plans to travel a lot during 2011, soliciting views from players and bridge administrators about the best ways to address problem areas. "I want to get a lot of viewpoints," he says. "I want to convince people that bridge is not just a game, it is a source of values, such as friendships. I want players to be proud of their game and of being a member of a federation."

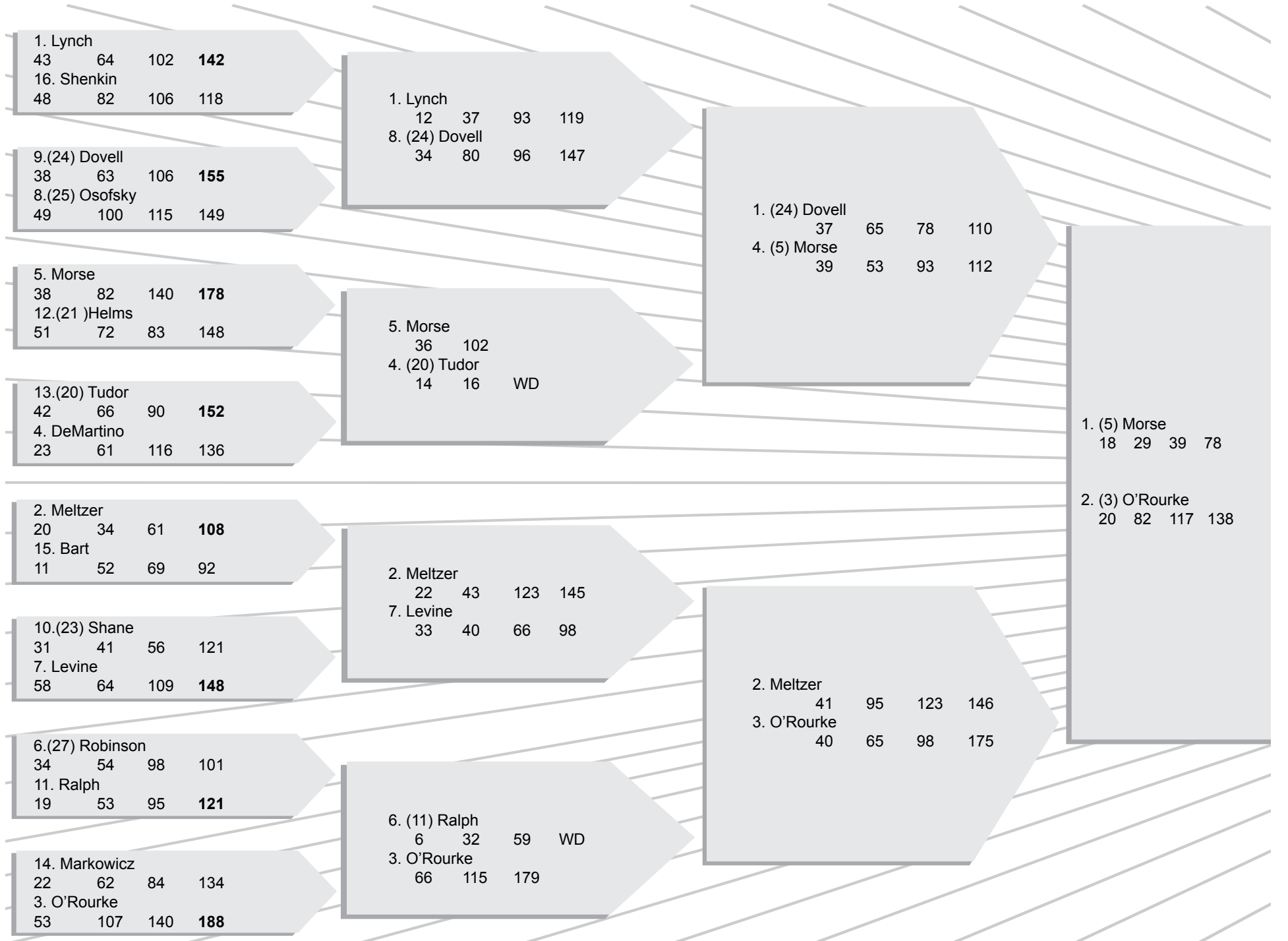

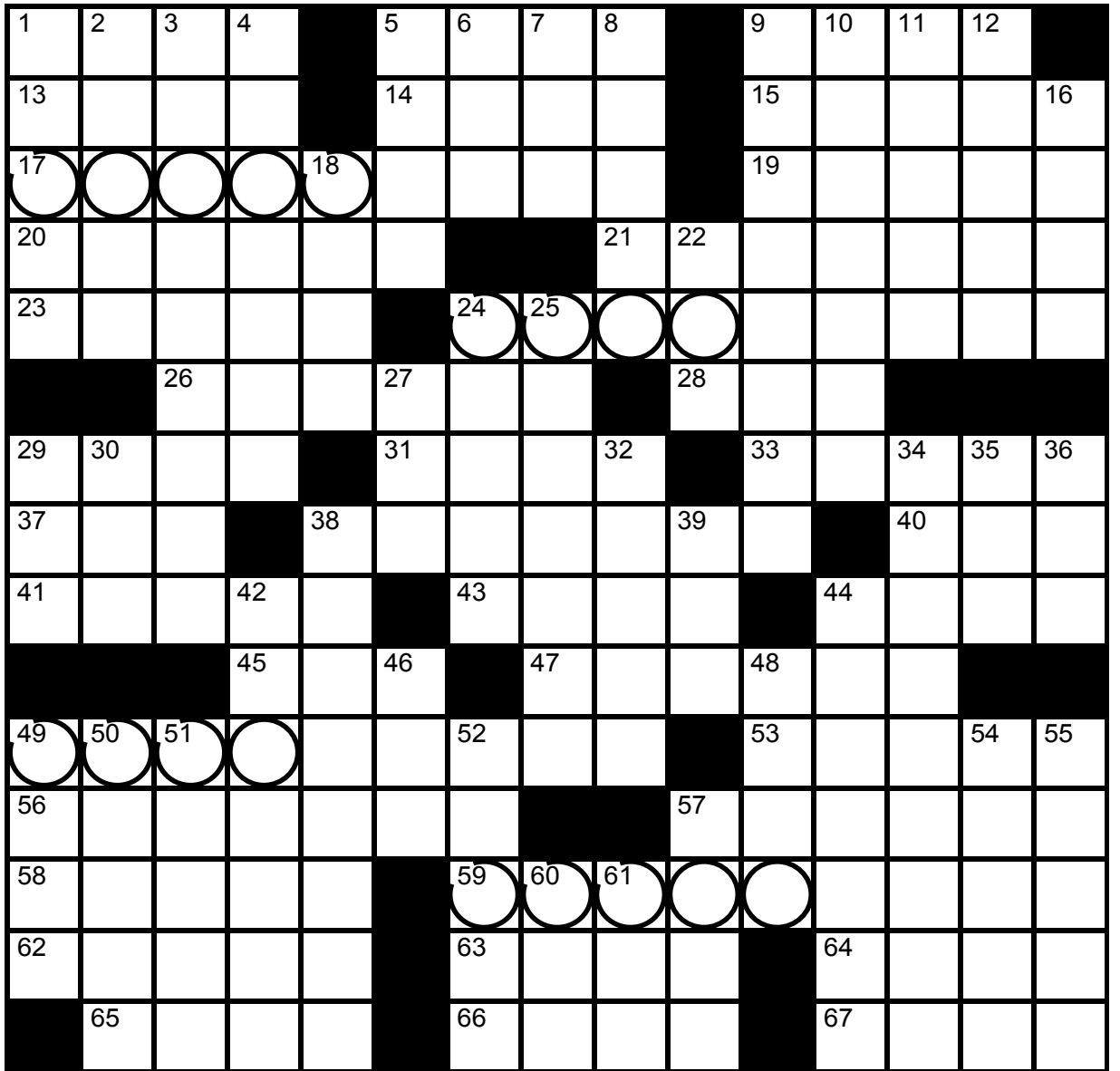

I would guess that the field played in 4♥ from the South side – it's easy enough to defeat from the North seat.

When South declarer 4♥, West might well lead a spade (especially if he's an idiot like me).

After a club lead to the 10 and queen, there is only one defense. East could logically (and unsuccessfully) play partner for the ♠A x x, but the winning play is to return a club (low to indicate suit preference if necessary). When partner wins the ♥A, he can put you in with a diamond to give partner a club ruff.

## Electronic Device Policy

The electronic device policy is revised as follows:

1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.

2. For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.

3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

Garner often played with her very dear friend, Terry Michaels, and in 1967 they won the Women's Pairs at the Spring NABC in Seattle. She will be missed.

Arnold and Muriel Rosen were long time residents and respected philanthropists of Miami FL, and Boone NC. After his Navy service in
