Strul leads Jacoby Open Swiss

The team captained by Aubrey Strul is leading the Jacoby Open Swiss going into today's final. Their score was 119 victory points. Two teams were right behind them in a tie for second-third.

The other members of the leading team are Bob Jones, Peter Weichsel, Marcin Lesniewski, Louk Verhees and Jan Jansma.

Two teams are tied with 116 VPs. The Piotr Tuszynski squad also includes Apolinary Kowalski, Farid Assemi, Ed Wojewoda, Nick Bykov and Srikanth Kodayam. The other second-place team is David Maidman, Marin Marinov, Ruman Nenov Trendafilov and Kalin Karaivanov.

A total of 60 teams qualified for today's final.

Baker squad leads in Women's Swiss

The team captained by Lynn Baker held a slim margin heading into the final two sessions of the Machlin Women's Swiss Teams.

Baker is playing with Karen McCallum, Lynn Deas, Beth Palmer, Irina Levitina and Kerri Sanborn. After the first two qualifying sessions, the Baker squad had 110 victory points.

Second with 106 VPs were Marinesa Letizia, Carlyn Steiner, Linda McGarry, Laurie Kranyak, Kathy Sulgrove and Linda Perlman. Also close to the top with 103 VPs were Hansa Narasimhan, Rozanne Pollack, Jill Levin, Jill Meyers, Debbie Rosenberg and JoAnna Stansby.

North Carolina pair lead NAP Flight B

Lance Shull and Audrey Ventura of Raleigh NC took the lead after two qualifying sessions of the Golder North American Pairs Flight B. The grass roots event is limited to players with 1500 or fewer masterpoints. Shull and Ventura enter today's play with a carryover of 33.47 matchpoints. Right behind them were the South Carolina pair of William Norteman Jr., of Woodruff, and George Russell of Moore.

Henner-Welland wins Vanderbilt thriller

Trailing by 16 IMPs with a set to go in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, the squad captained by Christal Henner-Welland played a near flawless fourth quarter to pull out a hard-fought victory 118-103 over the Lou Ann O'Rourke sextet.

Henner-Welland played with Italian star Antonio Sementa. Their teammates were her husband, Roy Welland; Bjorn Fallenius and Polish experts Adam Zmudzinski and Cezary Balicki.

O'Rourke's squad was Marc Jacobus, Eric Greco, Geoff Hampson and two members of the reigning Bermuda Bowl champions from Italy: Norberto Bocchi and Giorgio Duboin.

It was the first time in the history of the Vanderbilt that the opponents in the final were captained by women. Henner-Welland is the first woman to win the Vanderbilt since Edith Kemp in

Eugene Sor of Richard CA and Marcus Ballinger of Burlingame CA held a slim lead in the President's Cup North American Pairs Flight C. The event concludes today with two final sessions. The event is limited to non-Life Masters.

The leaders ended the two qualifying sessions

with a carryover of 33.07 matchpoints, just ahead of the 28.16 MPs amassed by another California pair, Dayou Zhou of La Jolla and Jon King of Balboa Island. Close behind them were Alan Colker and Lynne Colker of Pittsburgh PA.

St. Louis NABC has been smooth sailing

The worst hand ever

In the second final session of the Lebhar IMP Pairs, on board 5 Adam Wildavsky was dealt:

♠5 4 3 ♥8 4 2 ♦7 6 5 3 ♣8 6 4.

“This was not only the worst hand I’ve ever held,” said Wildavsky, “it’s the worst hand I’ve ever seen! At least I held the ♥8,” he said, tongue-in-cheek.

This may be an uninteresting hand, but it was about to become exciting. Here is board 5 with the hands rotated.

Wildavsky’s partner Doug Doub doubled the first time, then bid 4NT for takeout.

“I had the ♦5 in my hand,” said Wildavsky, so I bid 5♦.”

Against 6♦, West led the ♥A and another heart. Wildavsky won the ♥K, pulled trumps and claimed. Making slam was worth 12.92 IMPs and helped the pair finish 16th. Notice that after the ♥A opening lead, the contract was cold. If West switched, declarer wins and pulls trumps as before. Since he can’t get to his hand, he will bang down the ♥K, dropping the queen.

It was reported that at another table, 6♦ was declared from the North hand. Declarer ruffed the opening lead, drew trumps and led the ♥K from his hand. When this was ducked all around, another heart was led - crashing the ace and queen - and declarer scored his slam.

“Ducking is an important technique at bridge,” Wildavsky dryly noted, “but so is taking your tricks.”

Justifying the bidding

On this deal from an IMP game, John Zilic employed an old Yogi Berra-ism – It ain’t over ‘til it’s over – to land a slam.

West started with the ♣7. Zilic played low from dummy, and East played the ♣Q, ruffed by Zilic. When declarer cashed the ♠A, West dropped an ominous king. It looked like there were two inevitable losers in trumps, but Zilic soldiered on. He played a diamond to the jack and king, then called for the ♣K, ruffing when East covered.

Now came the ♦A, ♦Q, ♥A and the ♦9 ruffed in dummy with the ♠5. Zilic then cashed the good ♣J and played the ♥K. This was the position:

Zilic played the ♥10 and East was done for. If he ruffed with the ♠7, Zilic would overruff with the 8 for trick 11 and concede a trick at the end after playing the ♠Q. Ruffing with the ♠10 or ♠J would be the last trick for the defense, as East would then be left on lead with only trumps, forced to lead into dummy’s trump tenace.

That was a well-earned plus 1430.

Interestingly, at the other table, declarer in a 4♠ contract played dummy’s ♣J on the opening club lead and, after ruffing, played a low trump from hand. With the timing completely screwed up, declarer went down in game, giving Zilic’s team a 17-IMP swing.

Desperate measures

On this deal from the second final session of the Lebhar IMP Pairs, Dick Budd knew declarer was on the right path to make his game, so some obfuscation was in order. Budd was West (hands rotated).

North’s 2♣ bid was a spade raise.

Budd led the ♣4 to the 3, 9 and king. Declarer than played a spade to the queen and dummy, following with a diamond to the king and Budd’s ace. Another club from Budd knocked out

declarer’s ace. South picked up the outstanding trump with a spade to the ace, then ruffed dummy’s other diamond before exiting in clubs.

Budd played the ♣Q, felling his partner’s jack. At that point, Budd knew declarer had adopted the right line to make his contract. By eliminating the minor suits, declarer was forcing Budd to make a play in hearts, and the cards lay well for South. On a low heart from Budd, declarer plays low from dummy, forcing East to play the king, and allowing South to lead up to the ♥J and hold his losers in the suit to one.

If South read the cards accurately, he could simply take the heart return with the ace, even if East played low, and simply exit with a heart. East would be in and forced to give declarer a ruff-sluff, and his heart loser would go away.

Because of the ♥J in dummy, it would do no good for East to play the ♥K.

Budd could see things were lying well for declarer, so he tried to muddy the water by getting out with the ♥10, giving declarer a losing option. If the ♥10 was West’s highest card, declarer could succeed by covering with the jack, later leading up to the 9.

Declarer could still have succeeded by simply playing low, but he took the bait and covered with the jack. East played the ♥K, and declarer could not avoid two losers in the suit. One down and a huge result for Budd.

Jacoby transfers

Keeping the high cards concealed and having the opening lead come up to the strong hand are the two great benefits of using Jacoby transfers. Back in the old days, when partner opened

1NT and we wanted to sign off at the two level, we just bid our five-card suit and down came that great dummy with all those nice points for the opponents to see.

In order to keep the strong hand concealed after a 1NT opener, responder bids the suit below the one they really have. The 1NT opener says the word "Transfer" – in bridge parlance, he "Announces" — and now bids the real suit.

How do we know it's a transfer? You and partner must agree that forever more we are playing transfers over 1NT. Transfers are also used when partner opens 2NT.

Let's examine how transfers to the major suits work. First of all, you must have at least five cards in the major. With a four-card major and sufficient high-card points, start with 2♣ (the Stayman convention).

Say you, South, hold

♠Q 6 2 ♥K 8 6 5 3 ♦8 6 ♣10 3 2

Partner opens 1NT (15-17). Here's how the auction should go:

With 0-7 HCP, transfer to your five-card heart suit by bidding the suit below it (2♦) and

pass. As the 1NT opener, you may have misgivings about bidding 2♥ with a low doubleton in the suit, but you have no choice. You must accept the transfer. Once you open 1NT, you have limited your hand, putting partner in charge. Here's another hand and auction to consider (you are South):

♠K Q 8 7 3 ♥A 6 ♦9 7 3 ♣8 3 2.

Partner opens 1NT. What is your plan?

Here is how the auction should go:

West	North	East	South

You have enough to invite game, but you can't be sure which is better, spades or notrump. The way to find out is to bid as above. South's transfer followed by 2NT describes a hand with five spades and 8 or 9 HCP. Partner's options:

Pass = 15 HCP and only two spades.

3♠ = 15 HCP and three or four spades.

3NT = 17 HCP and only two spades.

4♠ = 17 HCP and three or four spades.

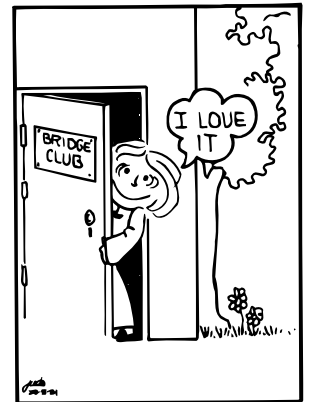
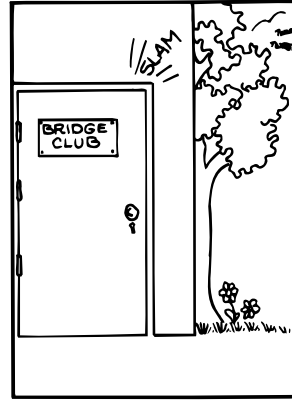
With 16 HCP, use your bridge judgment to decide how high to bid.

Here's another one for you as South:

♠A 7 4 ♥K Q 9 8 2 ♦Q 8 ♣7 6 3.

What are you telling your partner by bidding this way? You are saying you have exactly five hearts and enough high-card strength to be in game. By bidding 3NT, you are leaving it up to partner to choose between 3NT and 4♥. North

will pass with a doubleton heart and, in most cases, bid 4♥ with three or more hearts.

When you have six or more of your major, you know you have at least an eight-card fit, so you transfer and raise with invitational values. With game values, transfer and bid game in the major.

Opening lead: ♥7.

Bidding commentary: West is not strong enough to double and then bid hearts (16 or more high-card points with that distribution), so he settles for a 1♥ overcall. North's leap to 3♥ is a jump cuebid. A cuebid of 2♥ shows a more balanced hand. Assuming partner has opened 1♣ or 1♦ this game-forcing jump shows opening bid values, five- or six-card support and denies a four-card major. Perfect. Had partner opened a major, a splinter jump can be made with four-card support. South has no trouble rebidding 3NT with reasonable hearts plus a balanced hand.

Lead commentary: Undaunted, West leads his longest suit. After East plays the ♥10 and South the jack, West knows that South remains with the ♥K 9. The play of the 10 by East has

denied the 9, remember? The 10 also denies the king. Holding three hearts to the king, East would have played the ♥K at trick one. Please.

Play commentary: As declarer, after winning the ♥J, count your sure tricks outside of clubs, the suit you plan to set up. You have one heart, the jack, the two top spades plus the ♦A. You have four tricks outside of clubs.

Translation: You need five club tricks, not six, to make 3NT. However, there is a problem. See it? If a club trick must be lost, it must be lost

1963. The last husband and wife on the same winning Vanderbilt team were Carolyn and Jerry Levitt in 1962.

With the victory, Roy Welland captured the Mott-Smith Trophy as the top masterpoint winner in the Spring NABC. He won the first NABC+ event of the tournament with Duboin, one of his Vanderbilt final opponents.

Zmudzinski and Balicki won the Vanderbilt in 2001 playing with Russians Andrei Gromov and Aleksander Petrunin. The rest of the Henner-Welland squad won for the first time.

The final started out as a slugfest. O'Rourke took the opening set 54-18, but Henner-Welland responded with a 51-14 second quarter to take a 1-IMP lead at the halfway point.

O'Rourke came right back in the third quarter with 33 IMPs to Henner-Welland's 16. Both teams played well in the fourth quarter as IMPs were hard to come by for either squad. Henner-Welland pulled close with a vulnerable game swing, then took the lead on board 10 of 16 with a 14-IMP swing. O'Rourke didn't score until the final board of the set, which Henner-Welland took 33-2.

Henner-Welland was highly complimentary of her team, especially Fallenius, who was sick most of the week but maintained his usual high standard of play anyway.

She said she has been playing with Sementa since last summer. They first met when her team lost to his in the Vanderbilt in 2005 in Pittsburgh.

"Everyone played great," she said of her team, "and I'm so happy I don't have to read the (system) notes any more."

Ask Rozanne

This is the time of year when even inveterate bridge players have the distraction of that phenomenon known as March Madness, the college basketball tournament.

That would be Rozanne Pollack, who last year placed second in a bracket pool that included 300 entries, many of them bridge players.

Pollack allows that when she entered last year, she didn't know much, but she did a bit of studying on the teams. She can't remember who she picked to win it all – it was the University of Florida – but this year she has chosen Ohio State. The Buckeyes won in overtime on Saturday, so she's still alive.

She came back for more this year in part because second place in the pool paid more than \$1000 – “and I got a tee shirt.”

Pollack notes that her husband, Bill, is also in the pool, and he picked North Carolina to win it all – “because I filled out his entry.”

299er's luck

On the first Friday of the NABC, Mira Rowe of Newhall CA had a bridge date for the tournament, but her partner didn't show. Rowe decided to kibitz instead of leaving, so she asked a tournament director who she should watch.

She was steered to the table of Becky Rogers.

This is what Rowe had to say about her evening as a kibitzer:

“Boy, (Becky) was fabulous and captivating. In between deals, she kindly talked to me and had a few invaluable tips I want to share. She said I should kibitz a mentor, work with (my mentor) to improve my game and get over being emotional. She said bridge is a lot of serious, hard work. She said look for a partner who is serious, unemotional and friendly.

“In between matches, Becky did the crossword puzzles. She considers the sudoku puzzles to be a form of meditation. What an admirable and inspiring lady Becky Rogers is. I'm so glad my partner stood me up.”

Nash the Rambler

Laura Nash, of Stephenville TX, hasn't been playing duplicate that long, but she is dedicated. Her home town is 60 miles southwest of Fort Worth, which is where she plays bridge two or three times a week (she's taking a break from Texas bridge by attending the NABC in St. Louis). Getting to the Fort Worth Bridge Studio is a 140-mile round trip, and Nash has put more than 39,000 miles on a car she bought less than a year ago. She runs a game once a month in Stephenville but goes to Fort Worth to earn her masterpoints. “I love the game,” she says.

If you're one of those players who believe there's something fishy about computer-dealt hands, talk to John Zilic of Houston.

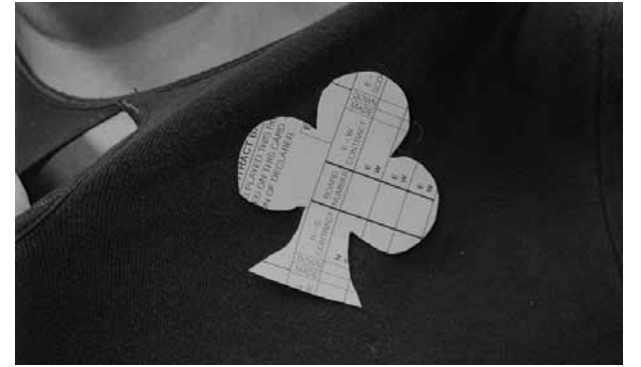
So far at the NABC, Zilic has seen one crazy deal after another, all dealt by people. Here are three samples:
