

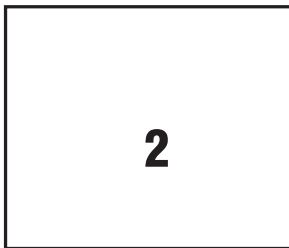

## Baze, Whitman lead Blue Ribbon into semifinal

Grant Baze and Michael Whitman put together two 63% games to take the lead after two qualifying sessions of the Blue Ribbon Pairs. Their matchpoint total of 2104.82 left them just ahead of perennial contenders Geir Helgemo of Norway and Tony Forrester of England.

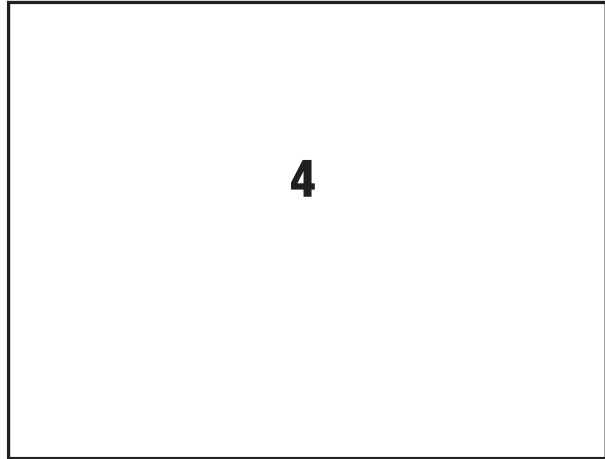

## Players rally to solve caddy shortage problem

Jackie Matthews, the tournament director in charge of caddies at NABCs, is used to dealing with an eclectic group, mostly youngsters. At the Fall NABC in St. Louis, she's seen an even wider variety of caddies, thanks to the response to a shortage of caddies earlier in the week.

Matthews was gratified at the way players answered the plea for caddy help published in the *Daily Bulletin* Sunday and Monday. Quite a few players gave up their time to pitch in and help.

The volunteers included Barbara Piltch, wife of ACBL President Howard Piltch, and tournament director Bob Bratcher. Other helpers were Janice Nakao, Penny Prine and two whom Matthews knows only by their first names -- Michael and Bridget.

"We had nine adult caddies the other night," said Renee Jaffee, a Tucson AZ resident who is studying graphic design at Washington University in St. Louis.

"They were wonderful," said

One of the first to volunteer was Maizie Ho of Honolulu.

"I read about it (the need for caddies) in the *Bulletin*," she said. "I wasn't playing so I thought I might as well help."

Bernice Gee of Regina SK thought she would help out for one session. On Tuesday night, she was working her fourth session -- in the section where her husband, bridge pro Ken Gee, was playing.

"He's taken a lot of razzing about that," Bernice said. "His friends are telling him that if we're that hard up they'll pass the hat."

Phyllis Burstein of Springfield NJ was another volunteer. She worked the Senior Knockout Teams. "It was fun," she said.

The regular caddies were grateful for the help as the group pulled together to take up the slack.

The semifinal matchups, by captain, are Robert Cartheaux versus Jim Sternberg and Mike Levine versus Shome Mukherjee.

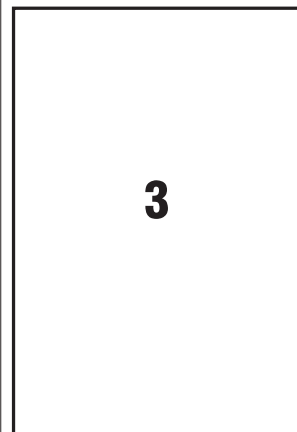
Sternberg is playing with three former Bermuda Bowl champions -- Billy Eisenberg (1970, 1971, 1976, 1977 and 1979), Eddie Kantar (1977 and 1979) and Fred Hamilton (1976, plus the World Senior Pairs in 1994). Also on the team are Allan Cokin and Richard Reisig.

Russ Arnold, a member of the Levine team, won the Bermuda Bowl in 1981. Their teammates are Zeke Jabbour, Arnie Fisheer, Jim Linhart and Swedish star P.O. Sundelin.

The semifinalists all had relatively easy going in the quarterfinals.

The top-seeded Cartheaux team fell behind the squad led by Gerald Schneider of St. Louis after one quarter, 53-34, but came roaring back in the second set with a 72-20 blitz to

## Jerry Gaer becomes Grand Life Master

By winning the Bracketed Knockout Teams, Bracket 1, Jerry Gaer of Phoenix became the newest Grand Life Master in the ACBL. Gaer won the Senior Swiss Teams in Albuquerque last summer.

A bridge pro and teacher, he has won more than 100 regional titles. He is a member of the Goodwill Committee and the National Appeals Committee. He was a unit president for two years and has served for many years on his unit board. An ex-tournament director, he was co-chairman of the recent NABC in Phoenix.

## Bobby Wolff's assistance sought for Junior team training

Six years ago, Bobby Wolff was the leader of and driving force behind the training for the ACBL Junior teams preparing to play in the World Junior Bridge Championships in Ann Arbor MI. The ACBL teams finished first, second and fourth.

Now, the International Events Committee of the ACBL Board of Directors has asked Wolff to undertake the task again as several Junior teams prepare for the team trials now scheduled to take place during the

1998 Summer NABC in Chicago.

The committee set the Junior trials for the NABC's second Saturday and Sunday -- and possibly the Monday following the tournament. Dan Morse, chairman of the committee, said that if eight or fewer teams enter the trials it will be a two-day event.

Morse said two teams will be selected to represent the U.S. at the 1999 World Junior Bridge Championships -- the winner of the trials and

## 4th finesse works

It's surprising how often the appearance of a hand in the Daily Bulletin triggers reactions in other players to report what happened to them on the same deal. Jon Brissman came by yesterday to tell what happened to him on the "Freedom of Choice" hand that appeared on page 8 of yesterday's Daily Bulletin.

Brissman also got the opening lead of the ♠J against his 3NT contract, but he went up with the ace immediately. He figured he could discover where the ♠K was by West's play, and he was right -- West played low, an encouraging card.

He led the ♦J to see what would happen, and when West covered, he took the ace. Next came the ♠10, ducked, followed by a second club finesse, which lost to West's king. West switched to the ♥J, but Brissman went up with the ace and ran the clubs. Then, seeing no other legitimate play for his contract, he tried a finesse to his ♠9. Success!

With all three kings lying wrong, Brissman believes that maybe the double finesse in diamonds was the best way to find the ninth trick on this deal.

## The history of Precision

The Daily Bulletin story earlier this week about the origins of the Precision System was incomplete.

C.C. Wei began his work on the Precision System in 1964, not in 1967. His idea was to combine a strong club with five-card responses, together with five-card majors and a weak no Trump.

While I was working at the ACBL, then in Manhattan, he invited me to lunch and showed me his manuscript. It was a very good Chinese lunch and I thought I owed him something so I took a hard look. He had made no provision for 4-4-4-1 hands, so I suggested a 2♦ opening with short diamonds and the "impossible negative".

At that time the ACBL required systems to be registered and he asked me to do it for him. Soon afterwards I called him to say that I had done so. The League, I explained, required each system to have a name. As a temporary move I had listed his system as

"Precision"!

# Slam forked over

You don't often see two Morton's fork coups in one session, but Jonathan Steinberg of Toronto was seeing forks in his sleep after a Swiss teams event earlier in the week. In one, a teammate created a Morton's fork position -- where a defender is faced with losing options -- via a defensive error, allowing a doubled game to make.

Steinberg, playing with Bert Eccles of Montreal, got it back on this deal, again aided by a defensive error.

West led a trump and Steinberg quickly played three rounds of hearts, ending in dummy. Along the way, East made a fatal discard -- a club.

At trick four, Steinberg played the ♠Q, which held, and a spade to the ace. When West discarded, the slam looked hopeless because Steinberg didn't have the entries to dummy to ruff out spades and then return to use them.

Rather than give up, however, Steinberg played the ♦K from hand, catching West in a Morton's fork coup.

The term comes from days in England when Cardinal Morton collected taxes -- those who lived well could obviously afford to pay a lot; those with a lower standard of living obviously had saved enough to pay a lot. It was said rich and poor were impaled on Cardinal Morton's fork.

Anyway, West had no winning option when Steinberg played the ♦K. If West took the ♦A, the ♦Q would provide the extra dummy entry Steinberg needed to ruff out the spades and return to use them. If West ducked the ♦K, Steinberg could discard the ♦Q on the ♣A and ruff two clubs in dummy. That's why the club discard by East was fatal -- the two club ruffs would fell the king and Steinberg would lose only a diamond in the end.

## International Fund game

A special two-session International Fund game will take place Thursday and Friday mornings. The money raised will be used to help with expenses of the players who will represent North America in the World Championship in Lille, France, next year. Both sessions will begin at 9 a.m., and the entry fee will be \$40 per pair.

# Happy boards for Women's Teams champs

The new Women's Board-a-Match champions had a couple of boards they were happy to talk about after their four-board win. A couple of the key hands came against the Wei-Sender team.

Rozanne Pollack and Connie Goldberg defended 4♥ on a diamond lead. Once declarer ducked this, she could win 11 tricks, which looked like a reasonable score. Sure, East-West might well reach slam and go down.

In fact, Sue Picus and Lisa Berkowitz played 3NT, but North-South had an accident on defense. South led the ♠Q, and the partnership obviously had a disagreement as to their opening leads since North unblocked the jack! Picus won the ace and drove out the ♥Q. South won and continued with a low club. Eleven tricks in notrump won the board by the smallest possible margin -- 10 points.

Pollack and Goldberg bid 1♠ - 1♠ - 2♠ - 4♠ -- not unreasonable, but the decent slam was missed. However, when Beth Palmer and Lynn Deas held the North-South cards, they started with a 14-16 INT. Over the Stayman response Berkowitz stepped in with 2♦ and South bid 2♥. North responded 3♣ (forcing). South bid 3♠ and was raised to 4♠. The resulting diamond lead held declarer to 11 tricks -- another win for the eventual champions.

Another pair of boards that the Picus team enjoyed were 19 and 20.

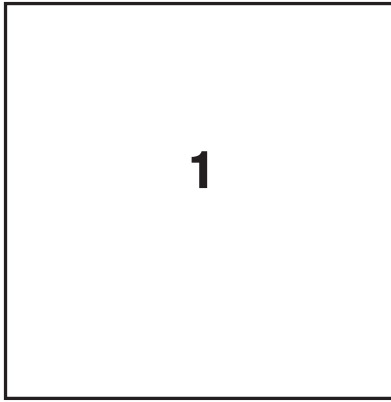

Picus and Berkowitz defended 4♥ by North after a transfer auction. Picus led the ♥9 and declarer won two top trumps. Then she misguessed diamonds, finally losing one spade, one trump and two diamonds.

By contrast Goldberg received the ♣8 lead. She

won in hand, cashed the top hearts and played a diamond to the 10. Now a club to the 10 let her pitch the spade loser and make the overtrick. Remember -- in board-a-match those overtricks are golden!

Berkowitz opened 3♣ as West and bought it there. The ♠10 was won with the jack, and South shifted to a trump that rode to the jack. Berkowitz played a heart to the queen and ace and North fell from grace by returning a heart. The spade loser went away as Berkowitz made her contract.

In the other room Pollack, South, reopened over 3♣ with a double, and Goldberg bid 3♥. The ♠J went to the king and ace and West was not sure who had the last club. She decided to shift to a diamond, and declarer ducked the queen. Back came a second diamond to the ace, and a low heart from dummy went to the queen and ace. Now Goldberg finessed in spades, ruffed a diamond and cashed the ♠A. This was the ending:

When Goldberg led a club from dummy West flew with the queen, leaving East a series of unpalatable options. If she ruffed her partner's winner to play king and another heart, dummy's club would take trick 13. When she actually discarded, Goldberg could ruff the next club with the ♥10, and the only additional trick the defense would take would be the ♥K.

There is a defense, however. West has to DUCK the ♠Q. Now East can ruff and draw trumps, leaving declarer with a losing club at the end.

# The suit is one thing, the wardrobe is another

The title comes from Danny Roth's new book, *Focus on Declarer Play*, in a section where the author makes the point that the theoretically correct way to play a particular suit combination may not be correct in the context of the entire deal. Take this layout, for example, which came up in a deal in the second qualifying session of the Open Board-a-Match teams on Sunday.

What card do you play from dummy when West leads the ♦5?

Most of us would play low automatically, perhaps giving some thought to inserting the ♦10. But now look at the whole deal:

West led the ♣K, promising an odd number in the suit, and switched to the ♦5 when East discouraged in clubs. Declarer made the "obvious" play of ducking, but East inserted the ♦9. Later, when West got in the the ♣A, a second diamond through ensured that the defenders could cash out five tricks before declarer could score nine.

The play to the first two tricks, however, had marked West with a fair club suit, and so his failure to overcall strongly implied that East held both the ♦A and the ♥K. A diamond shift from the jack was surely unlikely, which meant that declarer's correct play at trick two was to rise with the ♦K! Now the diamond suit is frozen for East -- he cannot play the suit again without giving up a trick. Nor does leading a club to the ace for a second diamond through help, for South can win the ♦Q and take a discard on the ♠J. With the defense unable to take two quick diamonds before declarer's club trick is established, South is in no further difficulty.

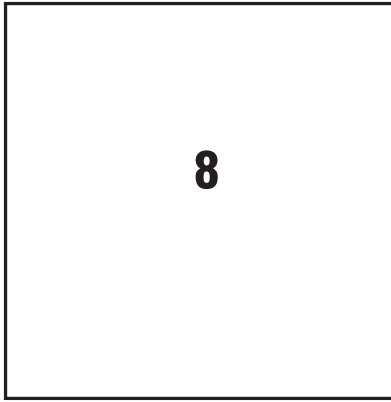

Blanchard led a trump to Krekorian's ace, and Krekorian surprised everyone at the table by continuing with another trump. Declarer won the trick in dummy and played a club to his king and another club to the jack and ace.

Krekorian put Blanchard in with a spade to the jack, and the ♦10 completed South's ruin. Declarer took four trumps and two clubs to suffer down five and minus 1100, a clear win for the Krekorian squad.

plan was to rebid to show 15-17. Rengstorff, with the long club suit as a source of tricks, also evaluated his hand aggressively and made the move to slam by splintering in hearts. Rengstorff spent some anxious moments worrying about a bad trump split in view of the auction, but when trumps proved to be 3-2 the slam came home easily for another win.

## Way to go, Bill!

Bill Pettis made an excellent play on this knockout hand to make a difficult slam and gain 11 IMPs.

Ron Sukoneck had no hesitation about taking his partner to slam in clubs despite his singleton - the bidding told him Pettis had a wealth of them. West's 2NT bid of course showed the red suits.

The play was over fast. Pettis won Harvey Brody's ♦10 lead and immediately led a spade, finessing the 8! That set up the pitch for the losing diamond, so Pettis lost only to the ♠K to score his slam.

Why did he take the first-round finesse against the queen-10? The vulnerable 2NT bid showed lots of red cards, so Pettis thought it likely that Brody had only a singleton spade. The odds were that it would not be either the queen or the 10, so he finessed.

But what happens if Gene Simpson, East, splits his spade honors and puts in the 10? Nothing, absolutely nothing. Pettis would win with the ace, cash the ♠A to remove West's singleton trump, and cross to dummy with the ♠K. Then he would lead the ♠J, taking a ruffing finesse against East and again setting up a pitch for his losing diamond with the ♦A still in dummy as an entry.

another team selected later.

Morse attended the Junior Day reception Saturday to solicit input from the Juniors about the format of the trials. The sentiment seemed to be in favor of a combination selection process -- trials winner plus another team chosen by a selection committee.

Morse emphasized that the winners of the trials did not have a guarantee that they would represent the U.S. in the world championships. Certain standards must be met, he said, "and any player can be removed for cause."

Wolff has not made a firm decision, but he said he was considering reprising his role as Junior team guru.

Rigorous training in an on-going process, he said, is a must if the U.S. Junior teams are to catch up with their counterparts from Europe. "The Europeans," Wolff said, "have solid coaching, teaching and discipline."

Part of the process in 1991 was a bridge aptitude test administered by Wolff, who considers it significant that the two players who scored highest on the test were the two who played the best in helping the U.S. capture the world Junior championship.

Wolff also organized a practice match between Junior players and the Spingold champions at the time, including himself, Bob Hamman, Jimmy Cayne and Chuck Burger, all of whom have extensive international experience. □

 Interestingly, the Granovetters had never seen Netanya before they moved there. It had been recommended by Kathie Wei-Sender, who converted to Judaism after marrying Henry Sender of Nashville.

"It's a little like San Francisco in terrain," says Granovetter, who can be found during the tournament hanging out at the OKbridge desk.

The Granovetters live in an apartment house with a view of the Mediterranean Sea. "It's very nice," says Granovetter, who is keenly aware that many Americans view Israel as a dangerous place.

"There's very little truth in anything you read in the newspaper about Israel," he says.

Everyday life in Netanya, a city of several hundred thousand people, is of high quality, Granovetter says. "Children can go anywhere without fear, and in Israel, everyone considers everyone else family even if they don't know you."

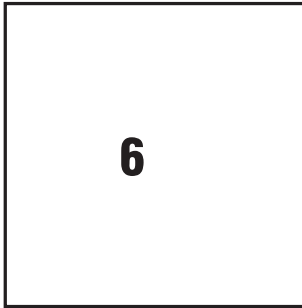
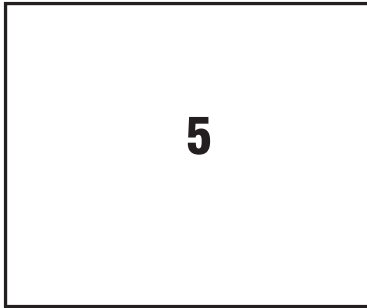
The Granovetter family is now Matthew, Pamela and three sons -- Daniel, 12; Harry, 10, and Shmuel, 3. The latter was born in Israel.

All the children go to school each day, Granovetter says, while he and Pamela work on the magazine and various books they have in the works. The latest is *Forgive Me, Partner*, just published.

Although Matthew and Pamela miss their U.S. friends, the family is probably in Israel for good. "Our children love it," Granovetter says, "and that's the most important thing for us right now." □

**The Facts:** 4♠ made five, plus 450 for N/S. With both clubs and spades splitting, the contract can easily be made with two overtricks. However, after a diamond lead taken by the ace, declarer pulled two rounds of trump, cashed the ♣K and then pulled the last outstanding trump. At this point, with the hand a claim, declarer, intending to run the clubs, discovered that instead of having pulled a club from his hand, he had played his last trump. He tried to retract the card immediately, but by the definition of a played card (Law 45C2), he admitted that the card was played. The Director allowed the table result to stand.

**The Appeal:** N/S appealed the Director's ruling. They were seeking no redress for themselves but were appealing because, "even if you feel that the interpretation of the laws is against N/S, it is ludicrous for E/W to be given a ton of matchpoints for a clearly inadvertent, illogical mistake, immediately corrected by their opponent."

South, declarer, confirmed the facts as stated, emphasizing that it was only when the card was in a played position that he looked down and saw that, though black, it was the wrong suit. East, the only defender present, said that, while she had

North led the ♠10 to the jack, queen and 2. South continued with a spade to the ace. Eccles played a diamond to his king and North's ace. A spade cleared the suit and Eccles was looking at 10 top tricks and a desire for more since he was playing matchpoints.

His next move was a club to dummy's queen and a club to the ace, allowing for the possibility of a singleton or doubleton ♠J. Then he played the ♥A (a Vienna coup) and ran diamonds. In the end, South could not hold out the ♥K and his club guard and Eccles scored up plus 460, good for 40 out of 64 matchpoints.

sympathy for declarer, by the laws of bridge as they now exist she was entitled to and therefore wanted her trick. This is similar to the situation which exists for revokes, where the opponents are awarded the trick(s) lost due to the revoke.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee unanimously upheld the Director's ruling on the basis that once it was determined and agreed that this was a played card, there would be no basis for the Committee to know the laws better than the Director. Since N/S were not asking to have their score adjusted, the Committee decided to return the \$50 deposit to N/S. The appeal would have been deemed frivolous had they been asking for a change to their own score.

**The Facts:** 4♦ made five, plus 150 for E/W. East broke tempo for 20-25 seconds before passing the double and the meaning of the Alert was not requested. At his turn, West asked about the meaning of the Alert and was told it showed the ♥A or ♥K (but not necessarily a heart raise.) South led the ♥J, covered by the ♥K and North won the ♥A. North led a small spade, ducked and won by the ♠10 in the dummy. Declarer then easily took 11 tricks. The Director changed the contract to 3♥ made three, plus 140 for N/S on the basis that West's 3♣ bid could have been suggested by East's break in tempo.

**The Appeal:** E/W appealed the Director's ruling stating that East was always going to rebid her good seven-card diamond suit. East stated she did not ask the meaning of the Alert because she thought E/W could make seven or more tricks in 1NT doubled.

**The Committee Decision:** The Committee decided that although West's 3♣ bid could have been influenced by East's hesitation, it was irrelevant insofar as the final contract was concerned because 1) the 3♣ bid made East's rebid less attractive and 2) if the 3♣ bid had not been made, East would have bid 4♦ over North's probable 3♥ bid or 3♦ and then 4♦ if necessary. N/S had an opportunity to collect plus 200 with reasonable defense or plus 500 if 4♦ had been doubled. The Committee changed the contract to 4♦ made five, plus 150 for E/W.

Sorensen had a tough bidding problem on his second turn after his partner made a negative double and East jumped all the way to 4♠. He finally took the aggressive route and bid 5♥.

West started with the ♣K, ducked. Although he would have been better off to continue clubs, he decided to switch to a diamond, leading the 9. Now East had a chance to be a hero by ducking, but he didn't -- he took his ace and switched back to clubs. Sorensen won and crossed to the ♥A, noting the fall of East's 7. He knew he could pick up the trumps even if West had four, so he came back to the queen. Then suddenly he realized he had only 10 tricks!

The solution was simple, but it was too late. Sorensen should have ruffed a spade back to his hand, then cash the trump queen and take the trump finesse. He then could get back to his hand with a diamond to cash out for 11 tricks.

This is how bridge games are won and lost -- wrong switches, failing to duck and failing to count winners. It's a good lesson hand.
