## Goodwill Committee honors Ralph Cohen

Ralph Cohen, recuperating from a series of life-saving operations over the past several months, was the Man of the Hour, Day, Month and Year yesterday at the meeting of the ACBL Goodwill Committee. A native Canadian, Ralph was honored for his contributions over many years to the ACBL, to the World Bridge Federation and to bridge in general.

It was an emotional experience. Aileen Osofky, Goodwill Committee chairman; Joey Silver, who learned bridge from Cohen in Montreal; Henry Francis, who has enjoyed working and associating with Ralph for more than 30 years, and Jordan Cohen, Ralph's oldest son, told of their feelings for Ralph and added some fascinating anecdotes and insights. Jordan offered an interesting highlight – all three sons went to their first North American Championship before they

were born.

But the highlight came after the speeches when droves of Cohens joined Ralph at the podium. There was Joan, his wife of 46 years, and his three sons – Jordan, Billy and Mitchell. His son's wives and their children were there as well, including Ralph's newest granddaughter who is only three and half months old.

Ralph has been involved in bridge through almost all his life. He learned the game when he was 13, and he won his first national championship back in 1946. He was a major force – some would say *the* major force – in Montreal bridge until Dick Goldberg brought him to Greenwich CT as his assistant. He succeeded Goldberg as CEO when Goldberg retired. Since leaving the ACBL office, Ralph once again is winning North American championships. He also is arguably the top authority on the laws of bridge in the world.

Things looked bleak indeed for Ralph last March. Joan took him to the hospital when he complained of various problems. By the time the doctors got through examining him, they discovered that he had a ruptured ulcer, an aneurism and a kidney problem. Later it turned out that he had four aneurisms, and the problem with

Although 16,000 tables is considered an outside possibility, attendance at the 2001 Summer NABC is sure to be the largest in seven years. The numbers so far – 7530.5 tables through Monday – are above estimates and project to roughly 15,500 tables for the tournament. Toronto will be the largest NABC since the 1994 Summer NABC in San Diego (15,879). The last Toronto NABC (Summer, 1992) finished with 16,680 tables.

You lead a high diamond and partner contributes the 9, discouraging in your upside-down signaling methods. What is your continuation?

In the other room, where Mitch Dunitz-Iftikhar Baqai opposed Peter Weichsel-Rose Meltzer, this was the auction:

Dunitz cashed two high diamonds and continued the suit. Meltzer's ♦Q was trick number nine and she scored up plus 600.

Larsen also led a high diamond, but after Ross's discouraging signal, Larsen found the killing defense – the top two hearts. Look at the entire deal and see if you can appreciate declarer's agony as she tried to select a discard on the second high heart:

At trick three, declarer was squeezed. A diamond pitch allows Larsen to drop the queen and take the first seven tricks. If Meyers had let go of the ♣Q, it would have been easy for Larsen to exit with a low club and simply wait with his top diamonds and the ♣K. At the table, Meyers pitched a spade, so Larsen cleared the diamond suit and waited to make the ♣K to defeat the contract.

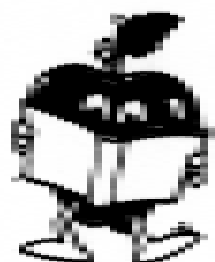
Beach and Kathy Aten of Plano TX went over together in the Sunday KOs. They have played together nine years and have been married for 29.

## TNT – a dynamite game

Sept. 1 is the deadline to register for the Lippo Bank World Transnational Open Teams, scheduled for Oct. 28–Nov. 2 during the world bridge championships in Bali, Indonesia.

Players wishing to compete should contact their national bridge organizations and request nomination. There is no quota. NBOs may nominate as many teams as they wish. Teams must be approved by the World Bridge Federation Credentials Committee.

The World Transnational Open Teams is a top-level Swiss team event that was inaugurated at the 1997 world championships in Tunisia.

It was very successful in Tunisia and more so in 2000 in Bermuda, where 73 teams entered the contest. One of the event's main attractions is that it is open to everyone (even teams that have been eliminated from the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup). Another plus is that teams may be composed of players from different countries, hence the name "transnational."

The 2000 competition was won by a U.S.-Polish team: Rose Meltzer, Peter Weichsel and Alan Sontag of the U.S. plus Polish stars Adam Zmudzinski and Cezary Balicki.

The entry fee for the event is \$800 (in U.S. funds) per team. There will be a separate Senior transnational event provided more than 20 Senior teams enter and wish to have their own event. If fewer than 20 Senior teams want their own event, Seniors will play in the open teams but the leading Senior team will receive a prize.

## Meet on the street, able at the table

Danny Miles, who recently moved to Toronto from Winnipeg, was heading for the subway last Friday -- he was on his way to the tournament to watch the Grand National Teams. He ran into a friend, and the friend introduced him to Elwyn Brown of Ottawa. A few minutes later Miles and Brown had decided to try the Friday two-session Open Pairs. After they finished playing the first hand, they knew it was going to be their day -- and it was -- they went on to win the event.

Miles and Brown were reasonably sure they could make the heart game, but they weren't optimistic about the five level. Brown thought his hand might be well suited for defense, considering his partner's takeout double, so he doubled. The big problem -- trying to find seven tricks for a penalty greater than the value of their heart game.

Brown led the ♥Q, picking up both the king and the jack. Declarer covered, and Miles found the killing shift after winning his ♥A. He underled his ♣A! Brown won and returned a club to partner's ace. Brown ruffed the club return and shifted to the ♦7, covered by the 9 and won by Miles with the jack. After cashing the ♦A he led his last club, enabling Brown to win his trump queen en passant. That was the seventh defensive trick -- Miles and Brown got the 800-point set they needed.

## Born to blush unseen

I am playing with Fred Alger during this NABC, and Fred takes the post-match analysis seriously. After winning a 26-board match 77-1, the team engaged in a very serious post mortem about the 1 IMP we lost, but no serious conclusion emerged.

♠ A 10 7 3  
♥ J 7 4  
♦ Q J 5  
♣ Q J 3

♠ K Q  
♥ A Q 9

You reach 6NT on an unopposed sequence and win the low spade lead in hand as East contributes the 8. You unblock spades and cross to the ♣J to pass the ♦Q. If it loses, as it did here, your way forward is clear. Win the club return in hand, cross to the ♦J and cash the ♠A. If the jack falls you have 12 tricks. If not, finesse in hearts for the contract.

But, I asked, what if the diamond finesse works? Then if you run the ♦J and it loses, you have no entry with which to return to dummy.

Fred had his answer ready -- lead the second diamond to the 10. If that loses, you still have the same continuation chances remaining. If it wins but it turns out that the suit is 4-1, then cash the clubs and play ace and another diamond. You will need the winner of this trick to have three or fewer clubs, with the heart finesse working, but that is your best chance.

Interestingly, taking the heart finesse at trick four is also a tempting alternative. You would plan to lead the ♦10 from hand if it holds, and you'd have good residual chances if the finesse lost. But the percentages are too close for me to calculate. The complete hand:

Both honorees have highly interesting histories. Read on.

### Kathy Whidden

"Everyone in my family has one outstanding talent," said Whidden, "but it looked as if I had been left out. But my parents took me aside and told me my special talent was people."

Truer words were never spoken. Whidden is that special kind of person who loves people and who makes people feel good. "I love the players – they're so interesting with all their sizes and shapes and ideas and personalities."

Whidden became interested in playing cards at the age of 3 (Concentration was her first card game), but she didn't take up bridge until she was 6. Her parents loved to play bridge, and they started calling on her as soon as she was big enough to hold 13 cards. When she got older, she tried social bridge, but she didn't like it – too much talk and too little bridge. The ladies weren't too happy with her – they told her to go try duplicate.

Well, she did exactly that – and she loved it. "Everyone had the same cards, so it was a game of skill rather than luck," she said. "And I really liked the people. Today all my friends are people I met through bridge – even my husband Chuck.

"I had to chase him. I had him talk to my novices one night, but he didn't get the hint – he didn't ask me out. I found out that he might be being transferred to Texas, so I got in touch with my parents to set up everything for him there. That elicited no response.

"Then there was a sectional in Macon, and I was walking back to the hotel after the game. It was 2 a.m., and suddenly there was Chuck. He came right up to me on the sidewalk and gave me a big kiss. 'That was very nice,' I told him. 'Would you like to go to the theater with me?'"

"This time everything worked. I moved in with him after two dates – and one of them I spent matching up his 60 pairs of socks. He didn't like washing socks, so he did it only once every couple of months."

So both Chuck and Kathy are involved in bridge – he plays and she directs.

But how did Whidden get into directing? Whidden was the Intermediate/Novice chairman at an Atlanta NABC in the Eighties, and Edith McMullin, who today is in charge of Easybridge!, was impressed by her. She told Whidden she should look into getting to be a tournament director. Whidden took her advice, and clearly it was good advice. Whidden has brought her people talents to directing, and the bridge world is the better for it.

### Jeff Johnston

What does Johnston do at the ACBL? "I bring card tables. That's all." In a way he's right – if we didn't have card tables we wouldn't have a tournament. He admitted under close questioning that he also handles an "occasional detail" so that the players can enjoy themselves when they're sitting at one of the card tables. For instance, he had to fax 120 pages of custom declarations to get the ACBL materials into Canada. Believe it or not, the surge protectors were the biggest problem – they required all manner of documentation because they were manufactured in India.

Toronto is special for Johnston. He remembers the time back in 1985, before he joined the ACBL staff, that he had only 12 hours to unload eight tractor trailers with a crew of eight men operating eight forklifts.

"We effectively made that section of the Convention Centre look like a hotel in those 12 hours," he said. The woman in charge of the materials for the Holiday Inn convention was Janice, a woman Johnston barely knew. But he liked her work and her attitude -- "she did such a good job, hey!" So he asked her for a date. They were married three years later. Toronto is special to Janice, too, as a result. She usually doesn't go to NABCs with Jeff, but she's coming to Toronto.

Ask any of the people who Johnston works with, and they'll tell you that he never loses his cool no matter what. Nothing, but nothing gets him flustered. He remembers the day he learned how to stay cool.

"I was cooking at a Howard Johnson's, and it was graduation weekend at the local college. Everyone came to Howard Johnson's for breakfast and then headed for the graduation. It never occurred to the manager that they might come back, so he sent most of the staff home. But everybody came back after the graduation, and it was just me and the assistant manager.

"He pulled rank on me and opted to do all the meals while I prepared the toast and other mundane duties. Finally everything was ready – but suddenly he broke the

## Goodwill Committee adds 3 Canadian Juniors

Three Canadian members of the Junior Corps were given memberships on the ACBL Goodwill Committee by Aileen Osofsky, committee chairman. They are Craig Barkhouse, Susan Harbour and Josh Heller.

Prior to the induction, Jonathan Steinberg, ACBL District Director for District 2 (which includes the Toronto area), told of the accomplishments of the trio.

Barkhouse represented Canada in the 1999 World Junior Championship. He has taught bridge to young players at the university level and is a certified director. He also won the OKbridge Angelfish Award for active ethics and good sportsmanship.

Harbour, the youngest of the group at 18, became the youngest Bridge America director in 1997. She has been active in teaching and promoting bridge among young people. She is a strong supporter of ACBL Bridge Camps.

Heller was first in the Under 20 category of the 1999 World Junior Championships and was seventh overall. He is a member of Team Canada who will be traveling to the World Junior Championships in Brazil later this year.

## A bittersweet moment

It was a bittersweet moment, but Sandra Torano finally took a major step in her bridge career on Monday at the Summer NABC. (See photo on page 1).

For 22 years, she has carried with her a collection of rating point slips – a security blanket of sorts. During years of loneliness on an isolated farm in Puerto Rico, Torano clung to her collection of masterpoints. When she felt bad, Torano says, her collection "made me happy."

The slips – no longer used by bridge clubs but still redeemable with the ACBL – were earned at clubs in Puerto Rico and Maryland and on bridge cruises. As the years went by -- the first were earned in 1979 – the collection grew, but Torano did not want to let them go.

"I took them everywhere," she says. "I even had a special purse for them."

For the past 29 years, Torano has split time between Puerto Rico, where her husband works as an engineer, and Maryland. She recalls that bridge was her salvation in long stretches of loneliness. "It's the best way to make friends," she says.

She finally decided it was time to move to another phase in her bridge career – to turn in her precious collection – when she went over 100 masterpoints and earned her first gold points at the Hunt Valley MD Regional this year.

Her stack of rating point slips – 100 of them equals one masterpoint – totaled just short of 46. In one fell swoop, her masterpoint collection increased by nearly 50%.

Now, she says, it's time "to get serious about bridge. Before, it was just social."

Look out, bridge world. Sandra Torano is coming.

"That left just me to take care of orders for 130 people. I managed to take care of everything in 20 minutes. I didn't have time to think about it. Afterwards I realized that nothing bad had happened – the sun was still going to rise every morning. It was like a light going on in my brain – I can do this! I was 20.

"So now I'm calm all the time – although Janice might have something to say about that!"

What did he think of bridge players and their obsession with the game?

"That was easy for me to understand," he said. "Just before I came to the ACBL nine years ago, I ran an indoor baseball training center. I dealt with folks who were obsessed with baseball, so the off-the-wall mindset about bridge was easy to understand.

"I think a lot of players view life the same way they view a bridge hand."

How does Johnston decide to do when a tough problem comes up?

"I just say this is what I'm doing. Sometimes I'm right and sometimes I'm not." □

## Nickell–Meltzer matchup likely in Spingold

The Nick Nickell and Rose Meltzer squads --- teams that will represent the United States in the 2001 Bermuda Bowl --- are likely to meet again in the Spingold Knockout Teams.

Nickell (Richard Freeman, Bob Hamman–Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth–Eric Rodwell) won the United States Bridge Championship and designation as U.S.I for the Bermuda Bowl. They have also won six of the last eight Spingolds --- plus a few other trophies, such as the 2000 Bermuda Bowl.

Meltzer (Kyle Larsen, Peter Weichsel–Alan Sontag, Chip Martel–Lew Stansby) won the repechage final at the USBC and earned designation as U.S.II for the Bermuda Bowl. They are the defending Spingold champions.

### Other repeats

The only four-man team to win two consecutive Spingolds -- Canada's all-time greats Eric Murray, Sami Kehela, Bruce Elliott and Percy Sheardown -- won in 1964 and 1965.

C.C. Wei's original Precision Team came close in 1970-71. Tom Smith, Steve Altman, Joel Stuart and Peter Weichsel won with David Strasberg in 1970. With Gene Neiger replacing Strasberg, they took the championship in 1971.

Jimmy Cayne, Chuck Burger, Hamman, Wolff, Mark Lair and Mike Passell won the Spingold in 1989 and successfully defended their title in 1990, with Lew Stansby and Chip Martel replacing Lair-Passell.

### History of the Spingold

The Spingold Master Knockout Teams, first known as the Challenge Knockout Teams, was contested for the Asbury Park Trophy in the early days.

The runner-up team in the regularly scheduled portion of the event had the right to challenge the winners to a playoff. This right was never utilized.

In 1934, 1936 and 1937, the Masters Teams-of-Four and the Asbury Park Trophy were separate events, providing two sets of winners.

In 1938 the event became the Spingold Master Knockout Teams and a part of the Summer NABC.

At one time, the Spingold was a double elimination event usually lasting nine or 10 sessions. It was scored by International Match Points and was restricted to players with 100 or more masterpoints.

In 1965, the double elimination method was replaced by three qualifying sessions (subsequently reduced to two), followed by single elimination knockout matches. The preliminary qualifying sessions were dropped in 1970.

The Spingold Trophy, donated by Nathan B. Spingold in 1934, and the Vanderbilt Trophy, awarded to the winners of the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams at the Spring NABC, are ACBL's most highly prized trophies.

Spingold (1886-1958), a New York publicist, motion picture executive and patron of the arts, was one of the most influential men in bridge administration from 1937 to 1943.

Born in Chicago, he became a reporter on *The Chicago Examiner*, *The Chicago Record Herald* and *The Chicago Tribune*. Spingold's interest in show business brought took to New York City in the Thirties.

In 1932 he joined Columbia Pictures in a public relations capacity. He was named to the board of directors in 1940 and three years later was appointed vice president in charge of advertising, publicity and development. He became a vice president of the company in 1954.

Active in bridge from its earliest days, Spingold was named ABL Honorary Member in 1936. He was instrumental in effecting a peaceful merger between the American Bridge League and the United States Bridge Association in 1937 and became president of the newly formed American Contract Bridge League the following year.

He served for many years on the League's Board of Governors and Board of Directors. Spingold was also president of the Cavendish Club in New York.

### Spingold trivia

• Louis H. Watson (*Watson's Play of the Hand at Contract Bridge*) was a member of the winning Spingold teams in 1932 and 1935.

• B. Jay Becker and son Michael are the only father-son combination to win the Spingold. Their victory came in 1972.

• Edith Freilich and Billy Seamon are the only sister and brother to win the Spingold. Their 1963 team included Russ Arnold, Harold Harkavy, Al Roth and Cliff Russell.

• Bob Hamman is the all-time leader with 12 wins in the Spingold. Bobby Wolff and Howard Schenken have won 10 times.

• Oswald Jacoby also won the Spingold 10 times: in 1932, 1933 and 1937 for the Asbury Park Trophy; in 1934 and 1936 for the Masters Teams-of-Four and in 1938, 1939, 1945, 1950 and 1959 for the Spingold.

• Helen Sobel won the Spingold five times, the first time in 1944 and the last time in 1960.

• The last woman in a Spingold final was Luella Slaner in 1983.

## Deal of the Day: Women can be tigers too

Women's bridge is often referred to with less than respect by those not qualified to play in it, and yet it has its share of stars. One who falls into that category is former World Champion Margie Gwozdinsky. On this deal from Sunday's final of the Life Master Pairs, she demonstrated that she was not about to be pushed around by members of the so-called stronger sex. The North-South pair were Roy Hughes and Jim Green, Canada's leading representatives at the midway point in the final.

It is a well-established principle of winning matchpoint strategy to avoid allowing the opponents to play at the two level once they have found a fit, so it's hard to be critical of North's decision to back into the auction when 2♥ was passed around to him. Gwozdinsky's redouble told North that this was perhaps the wrong time, and perhaps South might have avoided the axe had he tried 2♠ on the way to 3♣. We suspect not, though.

Simply catching the opponents a level too high is not, in itself, good enough. You also have to extract the maximum penalty, and the women made no mistake. Gwozdinsky led a heart to the ace and Susan Wexler shifted to her singleton trump. Declarer did his best by withholding his ace, but it did him no good -- Wexler switched accurately to the ♣8. Gwozdinsky won the ace and continued with the ♦K, killing declarer's heart ruff. When she won the second round of hearts with the king, Gwozdinsky cashed the ♦J and played a heart to hear partner's queen: two down; NS minus 500 and no matchpoints.

When asked about the deal later, Wexler admitted that she had not enjoyed the way the auction developed after her less-than-robust third-seat opening. She was hardly about to risk incurring The Great One's wrath, though. "I remember a deal from very early in our partnership," said Wexler. "I learned that when Margie makes a penalty double, you had better be right if you pull it, and even if you're right she takes it as a personal insult. On deals like this, you simply pass and hope the contract goes down!"

# Wagar Women's Knockout teams

The Wagar Women's Knockout Teams is likely to feature by the defending champions, a new team and parts of U.S.I and U.S.II, teams that finished 1-2 in the recent United States Women's Bridge Championship and will represent the U.S. in the 2001 Venice Cup.

The team captained by Kathie Wei-Sender (Betty Ann Kennedy, Juanita Chambers-Jill Levin, Tobi Sokolow-Janice Seamon-Molson) won last year's Wagar, played at the Summer NABC in Anaheim. It was their first win as a team. All have multiple North American victories plus 13 world titles.

That's also the case with the e-bridge team: Jill Meyers-Randi Montin, Kerri Sanborn-Irina Levitina and Lynn Deas-Beth Palmer.

Meyers, Montin, Sanborn and Levitina are all members of U.S.I, winners of the USWBC. The other team members, Lynn Baker and Karen McCallum, are playing here in Toronto with Dutch stars Bep Vriend and Marijke van der Pas.

U.S.II, winners of the repechage final at the USWBC, is Petra Hamman-Joan Jackson, Shawn Quinn-Mildred Breed and Robin Klar-Kay Schulle. Hamman-Jackson and Quinn-Breed are playing here with Judi Radin-Sylvia Moss. Schulle has returned to play in open competition while Klar is taking a year off from bridge.

## The Wagar Trophy

The Wagar Trophy was designated by the ACBL

Board of Directors in 1995 and honors Margaret Wagar of Atlanta (1902-1990), one of the all-time great women players.

Wagar became Life Master #37 in 1943, the fifth woman to earn the ranking. She and Kay Rhodes share one of the most remarkable achievements in ACBL history -- they won the Women's Pairs four consecutive years: 1955, 1956, 1957 and 1958.

Wagar and Rhodes share another record -- one of frustration. They were second in the Women's Teams for seven consecutive years, 1952-1958.

Wagar's impressive record spans three decades and includes wins in women's and open competition:

- Women's Teams -- 1940, 1943, 1944, 1945, 1946, 1964 and 1965.

- Chicago (now the Reisinger Board-a-Match Teams) -- 1941.

- Spingold -- 1946 and 1948.

- Women's Pairs -- the four in a row with Rhodes plus 1944.

- Master Mixed Teams -- 1942, 1945, 1948, 1954 and 1964.

- Open Pairs -- 1947 and 1948.

- Mixed Pairs -- 1948 and 1949.

- Life Master Women's Pairs -- 1962.

Wagar served on the ACBL Board of Directors from 1960 to 1972 and was named *ACBL Honorary Member* in 1979. She was non-playing captain of the U.S. World Women's Teams in 1968 and 1972.
